To all our readers, "Good reading in 1989". We shall continue to add new titles throughout the year and hope that we shall not be badly affected by the current situation in Waitemata City, which is the main source of our funds.

For those who like a good family story, We strongly recommend "The Shell Seekers" by Pilcher - no overt sex or violence! Strongly evocative descriptions of scenery to an ex-patriate Pom.

"The Builders Theatre" by Kellerman is a good read for those who do not mind psychopathic murders. There are well defined characters and an interesting setting. Rather too much gratuitous bad language, which adds nothing to character or story, and unnecessary violence at the ending. (Where do prospective borrowers queue? - Ed.)

"Skallagrigg", a novel by William Horwood, is the haunting story of Esther, a cerebral palsy sufferer, and her search for the origins of the mythical "Skallagrigg". Trapped in a body over which she has no control, and like many of her fellow sufferers wholly dependent on others for survival, she endures the endless frustrations of an intelligent young woman unable even to communicate. Gradually with the aid of computers the mystery that circulates in the world of ther handicapped is unravelled, providing a thought-provoking insight into that world and a totally unexpected solution to the quest.
