10:22pm, Saturday 12 May – Van fire, Scenic Drive. While we were there, we gave a little 'inter-agency' assistance to a red-faced policeman, winching his police van out of a ditch after he misjudged his 3 point turn.

Winter Fires:

Every year far too many people face the tragedy of a fire in their home caused by hot ashes. The ash you clear from your fireplace or wood burner can take up to five days to cool. Place these in a metal container well clear of your home. Please remember the heater-metre rule – keep furniture, clothes and curtains at least one metre away from heaters and fireplaces. You should also turn off all heaters and your electric blanket before you get into bed.
