Reports from Murray Smith, Vice- President

Auckland Super City

At the May meeting of your Executive Committee, a report was received that outlined the Government's legislative programme in terms of the establishment of the new Super City for Auckland.

During the week commencing 11th May2009, two bills will be introduced to Parliament. The first bill will establish the Auckland Council as a legal entity as well as establishing a transition board. The board will be tasked with the responsibility of restructuring Auckland's existing eight councils and 6000-plus staff into a single entity. The second bill will deal with representation and go to Parliament's local government select committee for public submissions. A third bill is due to be introduced in September of this year and passed by April 2010. This bill will detail the structure, functions, roles and powers of the Auckland council and local boards. Further reports will be forthcoming once the detail of the proposed legislation is known.

Footpath Renewals

As part of the Council's proposed footpath renewal programme for the financial year commencing st July 2009, the following renewals have been programmed for the Waiatarua area:

Scenic Drive - Various sections between Quinns Rd and Brabant Rd - 21 metres

West Coast Rd - outside 787- 6 metres

Between Kauri Loop Rd and Rimu Rd - 12 metres

Beyond Raroa Terrace - 20 metres

It is interesting to note that Council owns and maintains 892km of footpaths and for the financial year ending 30 June 2010, a sum of 1.5 million dollars will be committed to the renewal, maintenance and establishment of footpaths throughout the city.

Letter to the Editor

Dear Sir,

Now that we can look forward to Auckland Super City we can now drop all the previous tree hugging nonsense that has been such a part of the Waiatarua scene for so long and become an important part of the new vision. It doesn't seem that long ago that we had groups at the hall discussing what Waiatarua should look like in 50 years' time. Well we don't need to stick to that any more. We can go ahead with a much more ambitious plan for Waiatarua. The potential for tourism both local and overseas visitors is huge.

Here are a few ideas - you may like to add to them:

- I. Widen West Coast Road to a four lane highway and include bike lanes and elevated speed walks for pedestrians. Underground all power and phone lines at the same time.
- 2. Drive a tunnel through the hill just below the Devils Elbow that will meet up with the Piha Road which should also be widened.
- 3. Widen the Scenic Drive to two lanes each way and clear the bush on either side to open up the views to both harbors as well as providing cycle lanes, jogging and walking tracks.
- 4. Build a replica Sky Tower on the site of the present Waiatarua Mast complete with revolving restaurant and bungy jump.
- 5. Install the Waiatarua Wheel, similar to the London Eye, at Arataki. A giant Flying Fox to be built going down to the Huia Earth Dam complete with gondola for return trips and for those not so venturous.
- 6. Establish a themed Fun Park with associated rides at Jacobsons Depot to link up with an expanded Rainforest Express train ride through the bush.
- 7. The site of the present Waiatarua Hall and library to be developed as a major shopping, cinema and entertainment centre. A bowling alley and indoor ski slope to be established. This area should also be developed as a major accommodation centre for the West Coast beaches and Waitakere ranges fun parks.
- 8. Ark in the Park to be re-developed and expanded with a fully fenced in area and netting overhead to retain the birdlife for visitors enjoyment. Revenue from entrance fees to be used to purchase further exotic birdlife as an added attraction.
- 9. Erect a sign similar to the Hollywood sign in Los Angeles spelling out WAIATARUA!!!!

As well as becoming a major tourist destination for the new Auckland Super City, Waiatarua will attract more residents to work in the area. This offers many opportunities to present residents to develop their land and provide all types of accommodation from luxury villas to high rise apartments.
