At 11.50 am on Sunday the 12th of May, the Fire service received a call that a vehicle had left the road and gone down a bank with a trapped person, however the driver did not know where she was on Forest Hill Road.

Fire Appliances from Waiatarua, Glen Eden, Henderson and Auckland Operational Support were dispatched.

Thanks to the quick spotting of Lyndsay Whittle, the Waiatarua crew located the vehicle in a paddock on Forest Hill Road. Upon investigation, the driver was found trapped in her vehicle and had to be cut free due to her injuries. Medical care was provided inside the vehicle from paramedics - Henderson's highly trained Rescue Tender crew supported by crews from Waiatarua and Glen Eden. Using hydraulic cutting tools (jaws of life) they removed the windows, side and rear doors of the vehicle, also the windscreen and roof, allowing the patient to be lifted from the vehicle and then carried in a stokes basket (stretcher) back up to the road to the waiting ambulance.

Library Report Jeannette Ziesler

"Men of Valour" – Ron Palenski. This is a very readable account of New Zealand's part in the brutal battle for Crete during WW2. Palenski has not focussed on who should carry blame for the loss but more on the campaign itself and the men involved.

"With Bold Needle and Thread" – Rosemary McLeod. A practical book with a range of things for the crafty person, plus some social commentary, hints and tips. McLeod accessed many vintage magazines and modernised 47 projects from them – a bit of everything.

"His Own Steam – The Work of Barry Brickell" – David Craig and Gregory O'Brien. Potter. Conservationist, engineer and railway enthusiast are just some of the words to describe Brickell. A series of essays cover many facets of the man and the superb colour plates tell the pictorial story.

"All Good Things" – Sarah Turnbull. This is a continuation of Turnbull's memoir started in "Almost French". Now she tells of her and her husband's move to Tahiti for his work and life on the island of Moorea . She tries filling her time by writing, but longs to have a child. This is a more personal account of her life and the IVF which results in a successful pregnancy.

"Wild" – Cheryl Strayed. Despite being an inexperienced hiker, Strayed decided to do the Pacific Crest Trail from Mexico to Canada by herself. She recognised that her life was out of control in the worst possible way and this may help her. She tells a gritty story of the journey and how she finished it, healed and strengthened.

"Country Girl"- Edna O'Brien. A memoir from the well- known Irish author, whose books were sometimes banned in her own country. Now in her 80s, she writes of a life lived, very often in the "fast lane", in London in the 1960s and since.

From the President

Hi.

Well 2013 has been an adventure for me which seems to continue, the latest being my journey into the world of Scam. In March I received an email with a job opportunity which I treated as scam and deleted only to have them contact me again a week later.

The offer was to pay me \$10,000 to use my photo in a poster ad campaign in UK and Europe, they had got my photo off facebook. So in consultation with my Lawyer daughter-in-law, we decided to play along.

In various emails they never asked for any detail other than name to put on cheque, postal address and contact numbers so no way they can get money out.

We also did checks on the persons and company on Google, Scam buster, Securities Commission and Fraud Department, all clean.

Finally a cheque arrived with these two emails in close company and even a phone call from the company "Crush Models Management"

"Good to know that you have finally received the payment, all you need to do now is to take the cheque to the bank and have it deposited on your account for clearing and crediting and also do not forget to ask the bank upon deposit when the cheque will clear and the funds be made available on your account, so that we could know how to go about further instructions and details"

"The first payment will be for \$8,950, you are to take out (\$1,790 for yourself, as your part payment, being part of your fee) the difference \$7,160 would be transferred to the appropriate quarters for Legal Documentation, Sign-up fee, administrative cost, studio fees and wardrobes. The second payment of \$8,710 which will be your balance take home would be paid to you on the last day of the shoot which will make your total take home equal to \$10,500 at the end of the shoot."

Although I still don't believe it I don't want to can it and find out later it was for real so off to the bank and in the depositing process into a separate secure account, the teller gave me the cover for international deposit where I learnt the following:

Bank cheques have to be cleared, they are not guaranteed money.

International bank cheques can be recalled months after issue and any used funds are to be paid back to the bank and we are talking 3-6months or more.

And to make matters even worse nobody can tell you when the funds are safe.

I kept the cheque and sent an email to them saying payment would have to be by electronic transfer to an account nominated by me. Guess what? Silence

I guess the main lesson here is be very careful who you accept an international chegue from. See you all at the Debate which looks like being another beauty.

Fire Safety - Electric Blankets

As we start heading in to winter, the last few nights I have put my electric blanket on to warm up the bed before I get in.

Worn and old electric blankets can cause electric shock, fire and possibly even death.

- Have your electric blanket tested annually by a qualified electrician.
- Turn off the electric blanket power when you get into bed.
- Do not place heavy objects on the bed while the electric blanket is turned on.
- Ensure electric blanket controls are not twisted or caught between the mattress and base.
- Make sure the electric blanket is tightly secured and laid flat on the bed.
- When not in use, store your electric blanket rolled up, NOT folded.
- Electric blankets are not recommended for use by babies or young children as bed-wetting may occur.
