Hello Waiatarua!

Great to meet a few more of you at the Quiz night last week (9 May). A very enjoyable

evening and now I will never forget that Michael Bublé is Canadian.

Last month I mentioned I'd try and bring you an update around the progress of the Auckland Unitary Plan and how that might affect Waiatarua. You'll most likely remember the media coverage of the sub-division proposals of the plan.

Here in Waiatarua we are in the so-called buffer-zone between the city and the forest and beaches. I discovered that sub-division is not permitted; or other activities that change the nature of the area. And the reason for this is the protection provided by the Waitakere Ranges Heritage Area Act 2008.

Rather than paraphrase here's what it says:

Purpose

(1)The purpose of this Act is to—

(a)recognise the national, regional, and local significance of the Waitakere Ranges heritage area; and

(b)promote the protection and enhancement of its heritage features for present and future generations.

To this end, the Act—

(a)establishes the Waitakere Ranges heritage area; and

(b)states its national significance; and

(c)defines its heritage features; and

(d)specifies the objectives of establishing and maintaining the heritage area; and (e)provides additional matters for the Auckland Council and certain other persons to consider when making a decision, exercising a power, or carrying out a duty that relates to the heritage area.

So this piece of New Zealand law recognises and protects the importance of where we live.

To carry out the intent of this Act the council is obliged to develop a Local Area Plan for each of the community areas. In 2008/2009 the council engaged with locals and the Waiatarua LAP was agreed in 2009. One of the key things this plan does is describe officially what Waiatarua is and where its boundaries are.

Because of the Super City amalgamation and a few other things not as much has been done on the plan as was hoped. This week we had the council visit us at the WRRA meeting to explain where there has been progress and where actions are planned. They have been visiting all the Residents and Ratepayers groups in the Waitakere Ranges Local Board. The Local Board works on our behalf to represent our specific needs to the wider council and/or other organisations.

By the time you get to read this the WRRA expects to have asked you what you would like to see happen in regards to the

plans in the LAP and we will be well on the way to submitting back to the council. If you haven't already read it, here is a link to the Waiatarua LAP: http://tiny.cc/4boxfx

I highly recommend taking a look, or if you want a nice colour printed copy get one from the Local Board office Glen Eden

Next month I intend to update you on our WRRA submission to the Local Board in regards to the LAP.

Fire Safety:

Worn and old electric blankets can cause electric shock, fire and possibly even death.

- Have your electric blanket tested annually by a qualified electrician.
- Turn off the electric blanket power when you get into bed.

 Do not place heavy objects on the bed while the electric blanket is turned on.
- Ensure electric blanket controls are not twisted or caught between the mattress and base.
- Make sure the electric blanket is tightly secured and laid flat on the bed.
- When not in use, store your electric blanket rolled up, NOT folded.
- Electric blankets are not recommended for use by babies or young children as "bed-wetting" may occur.
