Waitakere Ranges Local Board Plan

The consultation on the Waitakere Ranges local board plan opened on 13 July and runs until 13 August, by which date feedback must be received. The high level themes at which the board wants to look are as follows:

The Waitakere Ranges Heritage Area is protected and enhanced and connections with surrounding communities are strengthened;

We work closely with mataawaka and mana whenua partners;

We work to respect, protect and restore the environment;

Our communities are resilient and strong;

Our communities experience wellbeing, belonging and participation:

People have a range of opportunities to experience arts, culture and heritage; and

We have infrastructure and facilities which support and enhance our neighbourhoods and town centres.

Example initiatives include:

Supporting, delivering and advocating for restoration programmes in ecological areas that will improve public places and help private landowners;

Empowering communities to prepare for disasters, particularly remote coastal and bush communities;

Supporting communities to apply for greater protection for scheduled and notable trees:

Providing access to year-round affordable or free activities in local parks and facilities;

Expanding the local arts experience into the wider Glen Eden and Swanson area;

Working with Henderson-Massey and Whau Local Boards to increase our understanding of homelessness and housing vulnerability in the area, and of our role in supporting initiatives to address these issues;

Supporting a breadth of projects and activities to ensure funding allocations reflect our wide range of communities, including Māori, Pasifika, and other social and ethnic groups.

## New multi-purpose community venue unveiled

Exciting news for the local community. For the past year work has been taking place on the Packing Shed on Parrs Cross Rd in Oratia (formerly the Packing Shed Café) to restore it to its former glory. It has been transformed into a new, multi-purpose community space which will be known as The Oratia Collective.

They currently have superstar sourdough baker Kopiko baking fresh sourdough from the kitchen, and the aim is to get a small farmer's market up and running in the next few months (Council approval pending). Watch out for upcoming weekly yoga classes, a coffee spot on Saturdays, film nights, community get-togethers and lectures. The space will also be available for private events, and as a shared workspace during the week.

The space is open now for event hire and as a shared workspace for those interested. Yoga classes will start from the end of September. Social media should be up and running in the next few weeks.






