From the President

Kia ora

During this last month we have had some interesting discussions on the topic of water supply and in particular the potential challenges ahead for those living in rural areas of Auckland who use their own tank water systems

Water, as we know, is referred to as **the elixir of life** due to its importance in all aspects of life. The water sources in Auckland are under severe pressure again this year and so there is a need for us all to be conscious of how we use our water supply. Our dams are at a lower level than required which is putting extra pressures on the system resulting in water use restrictions across the region.

Those of us who live in the "rural" areas of Auckland and use our own water tank collection systems need to be aware how this affects us so we should be making plans around our water usage now. You will find a section in the newsletter where we have given some tips and contacts for a couple of water suppliers that will deliver to this area.

Water Tips from the WRRA

For those on tank water in our area.

Know the size of your current tank

 in the old days these were 3,000
 or 5,000 gallon tanks. Now you can get them from 1,000 litres upwards with the biggest for a residential being around the 30,000 litre mark.



- Know your water levels this will tell you at what level your tank water is at any given time and direct you as to when you may need to order water.
- Know the water suppliers that will deliver to your area and have their contact numbers handy – they will tell you the size of their tank, how much water they carry and at what price.
- Know when to order water if very dry then be aware that you may be put on a waiting list so do not leave it too late.
- Ensure that your gutters are clear.
- Check that there are no leaks anywhere in your collection process – this should include gutters, downpipes and the tank itself.
- Watch for dripping taps.
- If getting low then take short showers, big washes to the laundromat, use excess water for garden.
- Maybe a smaller 1000 litre tank for use in the garden and in an emergency, to flush toilets etc.

It is important to start planning now!

If you have any questions then discuss with your local plumber. You can also ask the question on our Facebook page (Waiatarua Residents and Ratepayers Association). I am sure someone will be able to assist.

Plant Me Instead

Get rid of a weed, plant me instead! Following on from the article in our October newsletter, here's another excerpt from the Plant Me Instead booklet. Garden escapee: Bear's Breeches (Acanthus mollis, left) Perennial with glossy, angular, dark green leaves and prickly erect spikes of purple and white flowers. Spreads by seeds dropped and moved by

water and animals, and by root fragments. Forms dense infestations under bush canopy and in dry, sandy conditions, suppressing native seedlings.

Plant me instead: Piu Piu (Blechnum discolor, right) Also consider: Harakeke (*Phormium tenax*) Arthropodium bifurcatum

Lady's Mantle (Alchemilla Mollis, below right) Also consider: Ligularia reniformus Pelargonium









Garden escapee: Mexican Devil (Ageratina spp., far left) & Mistflower (above, centre left) Erect,



sprawling perennials to I metre tall with narrow, dull green leaves with serrated edges. Small white, fluffy flowers are followed by wind-spread seeds. Can completely smother native plant communities and cause sediment build-up, flooding and instability in steep gullies and streams.

Plant me instead: Parataniwha (*Elatostema rugosum, right*) Also consider: Kakaha (*Astelia banksii*) Jovellana sinclarii / J.repens

Flannel flower *(Phylica plumosa, left)* Also consider: Victorian Christmas bush (*Prostrantha lasianthos*) *Jovellana violacea*
