#### In Memoriam—Sarah Turbott

#### 21 February 1965 - 19 February 2022

Sarah, daughter of Nan and Harry Turbott, and sister of Chris, grew up in Karekare at a time when there were a lot fewer residents than there are today. The family was well known in the district

Sarah sadly lost her mother, Nan, while Sarah was still at school. Sarah was at Oratia School and later at St Dominic's. Nan had bought ponies for herself and the children and this was the start of a lifelong love of horses for Sarah. She used to move the ponies, Kip and Yogi, around to graze anywhere suitable in the valley near the beach. Later the ponies went up the road to Lone Kauri Farm to be enjoyed by other children after Sarah went to work at a racing stable in Waimauku with the very successful trainer Davina Waddell. She was employed for several years there, further developing her knowledge and experience with horses.

Sarah was always a keen supporter of the Karekare Beach Race Days where she was a stalwart helping out in the horse entry tent. When her health deteriorated, Harry took care of her and they lived together in an apartment in Waterview. Later on, as Harry grew older, she spent several years in a rest home where Chris and

Angela Turbott visited her regularly.

Sarah will be remembered for her dry and quick sense of humour, her love of animals and her delicious scones.



## Plant of the Month— Toetoe

You may have noticed the blue/green tinge on the weeds at the side of the road, particularly on the pampas grass. It's to indicate where the council have sprayed weed killer (I have no idea what they have used).

It got me to thinking about toetoe, and how lovely the miniature versions look in gardens.

Commonly known as miniature toetoe, *Chionochloa flavicans* do best on a well drained site in full or partial sun. In Auckland

they like to be sheltered from the heat of the day and don't let them dry out while they get established.

0.75m high x 1m wide with soft green weeping, slender leaves, the pale green plumes can be 1-1.5m high appearing in early summer and turning straw-coloured as the summer progresses.

Here is little about the giant toetoe tussock grasses. Its numerous large creamy flower plumes on tall stems is an iconic part of the New Zealand landscape. Most New Zealanders would be familiar with toetoe, but many may be surprised to learn that toetoe is actually five different, but similar looking, species each with marked differences in distribution.

The largest toetoe, *Austroderia splendens*, the one we see in the Auckland region, grows in lowland sand dunes, cliffs and rocky places and is confined to Northland, Bay of Plenty and Waikato. All the other varieties naturally occur further south.

The chart below from Landcare Research tells the difference between pampas, toetoe and hunangāmoho.

The pampas grasses, two introduced Austroderia species from South America, are similar in appearance to toetoe, but are serious weeds in northern parts of the country.

#### Cathie Wells

	Toetoe	Pampas
Flowering time	Spring, early summer (though retains flower heads)	Late January to late May
Flower head	Drooping	Erect, dense
Plume colour	White/cream	One species pink/purplish, drying to dirty brown, white
Leaf	Won't break when tugged firmly	Breaks
Leaf blade	Prominent veins either side of midrib	Only fine, indistinct veins either side of midrib
Midrib	Continues into leaf base	Does not continue into leaf base
Leaf base	White, waxy	Not waxy
Base of plant	Dead leaves don't form spiral	Old brown tightly curled, fractured leaf debris – like wood chip
