Update on communications with Auckland Transport

The ongoing email exchange continues – AT seem to think our case is closed, however, there are still a number of outstanding issues, as previously outlined. The battle continues and we are hopeful of being able to enlist the assistance of the Community Board and Councillors once the final results are published. The email exchange continues.

Auckland Transport and roading issues in general are a very hot topic around the country with numerous articles in the Herald and also on various radio programmes – it would seem that we are not alone in our fight for better roads. One can perhaps live in hope that the new Mayor of Auckland will live up to his promise of dealing with AT!

There is a Public Meeting being held on 2nd November at 5pm at the Auckland Trades Hall, 147 Great North Road which features the Transport Minister Michael Wood; two of the WRRA Executive Committee members will be attending to see what he has to say. Please attend if you are able.

There is also a very interesting article in the October issue of the Ponsonby News (Facebook is @ponsonbynews if you want to read – page 15). This article touches on two projects planned by AT – one in Grey Lynn on Great North Road and the other on Meola Rd from Pt Chevalier Rd to Garnet Rd – a total expenditure of just on \$75 million; the work mostly includes controlled pedestrian crossings, cycle ways, bus lanes, restricted parking, humps and bumps along the roads, etc.

This expenditure at a time when our roads are falling to pieces seems somewhat ludicrous.

"Flora of Gondwana"

Talk by Shane Wright - Senior Lecturer Faculty of Science, Biological Sciences, University of Auckland

Thursday 17thth November 7:30pm

Shane is a Biogeographer teaching at the University of Auckland who has worked in Oceania for many decades. He has a particular interest in the floras of the more ancient land masses such as New Caledonia. During the early 1990s he spent several months in that country working as part of an effort by Conservation International and the Native Forest Action Council to secure areas of protected land in that very impacted landscape. A substantial component of his teaching now includes study of New Caledonia and it's ancient Gondwana biota. He has also travelled and worked extensively in South America.



It's been a pretty quiet month for us, with only one or two patrols out each week.

We are actively looking for new members, so please consider joining us and making a difference in your community.

Our team participated in the Henderson Heroes School Holiday event last Friday – run by Neighbourhood Support Waitakere, NZ Police, WestCity and more. This is always a wonderful family event – with lots of fun for the kids (big and small!).

We joined forces with both the Henderson and West Harbour Community Patrols – to showcase our activities, and provide some fun games for the littlies (with thanks to West Harbour Patrol for their





fantastically creative stand and activities).

Theft from mailboxes and vehicles seems to be on the rise in our area – so please take care to empty your mailboxes regularly (and add a lock if you are able to) and do not leave valuables in your cars if parked publicly.

If you do have evidence of your mailbox or vehicle being tampered with – please report it to Police on the 105 line (even if nothing has been stolen, as this is damage to property). This enables the Police to identify trends in the area.

Community Patrols—how could I help?

By being aware of our volunteers and giving us a wave when you see us on patrol.

Telling others about us.

Becoming a volunteer patroller for the Waiatarua CPNZ group (covering Waiatarua, Oratia and Henderson Valley – and more..). Volunteers are always needed for both daytime and evening patrols (weekdays and weekends). A flexible commitment of around 4 hours per month. Full training and uniform supplied. Police Security Clearance check and current drivers licence required.

Slower speeds on our local roads

Waiatarua roads will soon have reduced speed limits, as part of Auckland Transport's plan to save lives and prevent serious injuries.

Our main roads such as Scenic Drive, Forest Hill Road and West Coast Road, will go to 60kph, with side streets becoming 40kph zones.

The narrow winding residential side streets, such as Raroa Terrace and Kauri Loop Road, often have blind corners, reduced width and no markings yet are currently 70kph or even 'open road'.

The Piha Road intersection, a notorious high crash zone, will be reduced to 60kph while still allowing 80kph on the Nihotupu to Anawhata section.

Submissions to the Waitakere Ranges Local Board, received earlier this year, showed strong support for reducing speeds on all roads, and providing more footpaths and safe ways for people to cycle.

On the other hand, some submissions said reducing speed limits would not work and the roads should be improved to allow faster travel.

Auckland Transport is changing the speed limits for 1600 roads across the region. The changes come into effect in Waiatarua from March 2023 when new signage is due to be installed.
