CAKE RECIPE

This cake was a very popular item on the menu at the dinner which was catered for by the Play-centre.

Babousa, Egyptian Semolina Cake
Oven temperature 180°C,
Cooking time 30mins

- 1. Cream $\frac{1}{2}$ Cup butter, 3/4 Cup sugar and 1 tsp. vanilla essence, and add 2 eggs one at a time. Beat well.
- 2. Sift 2C fine semolina, 1tsp B.P. & $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp B.S., fold into butter mixture alternately with 3/4 Cup of yoghurt.
- 3. Spread batter into greased $20\,\mathrm{cm} \times 30\,\mathrm{cm}$ slab cake tin and place blanched almonds on top in rows, $(4\,\mathrm{x}7)$ to be centred on each piece when cake is cut.
- 4. Bake
- 5. While cake cooks make syrup. Dissolve 2C sugar in $1\frac{1}{2}$ C water and 1tbsp lemon juice (or 1tsp of lemon essence) over medium heat and boil rapidly for 10mins, then cool by placing pan in cold water.
- 6. When cake is cooked, pour cooled syrup over hot cake. Serve with blend of 50/50 cream & natural yoghurt.


