## Barbeque Care

Now that the barbeque season is upon us the Waiatarua Fire Brigade would like to remind people of some of the do's and don'ts regarding the care and attention of your gas barbeque.

Regularly empty the sand on the sand tray and clean with warm soapy water along with the plates and grille.

Make sure all hoses are in good condition. Make sure that the gas cylinder is in good condition and is within the test duration. Any doubt, contact the LPG/CNG cylinder test station.

When the gas cylinder has been connected check for leaks around the joints with soapy water: LPG is odourised to give it the distinctive unpleasant smell.

If a cylinder is leaking and the leak cannot be stopped by closing off the valve the cylinder should be moved to an open area clear of buildings, and people and the Fire Service should be contacted immediately by dialling 111.

Always keep a container of water nearby when cooking outdoors.

\* The contents are the same as that stated on the label. If not, please label correctly. Do not mix chemicals.

Fertilisers, Fibreglass resins,
Glues, Paint removers & thinners,
Weedkillers, Bleaches, Ammonia,
Polishes & waxes, Toilet cleaners.

The centre will not accept...... Industrial quantities of waste, Ammunition or explosives, Radioactive material, Medicines.

For those new to the area, and there are a considerable number of you, please note that whole bottles are the only glass you can put out in your bin. You can also put out plastic containers 1&2, and cans both metal & aluminium. If you have more than one binful per week, phone for an extra bin.
