THE PUNGAS

Marian and Peter George of 895 West Coast Road are happy to share with the whole of the Oratia/ Waiatarua Community the announcement that their home, "The Pungas" is now one hundred years old!

This grand centenarian of the district has been kept almost in the original setting as it was back in 1894.

The crown granted title to William Appleton on 17

April 1894 and he paid a price of £59-8-0. This was for a land area of 62 acres and 52 perches. On the 10 August 1894 Appleton advised the completion of a dwelling.


The pictures show the property as it was in 1924 and as it is now in 1994. The 1924 picture is



interesting as it shows people working on the property and the pine tree which now still stands at the gateway of "The Pungas".

People of note have been associated with "The Pungas", the most famous being the aviatrix Jean Batten, who visited on many occasions as a

schoolgirl.



One feature of "The Pungas" which is unfortunately no longer, is the seat placed in front of the house for weary travellers to rest as they plodded their way up the hill, and a cup of tea was always forthcoming.

The Georges, as present owners, have occupied the property for twenty years, this being the longest occupancy.

OUR FIRE BRIGADE REPORTS

Guy Fawkes

There will be a community Guy Fawkes night bonfire at the Fire Station on Saturday November 5. As usual, the Volunteer Fire Brigade will provide the bonfire, barbecued sausages (for sale) and a bar (including soft drinks). You can supply fireworks. We have learnt from a couple of near misses last year and so to improve safety there will be a separate cordoned area which must be used when lighting fireworks.

Arrive any time after 7 pm. The bonfire will be lit later, after nightfall. If the weather is unkind on the fifth, it will be held on Sunday 6 at the same time. Call the Fire Station on the night if doubtful - 814-9213.

Please remember - the volunteer firefighters are not there to act as baby sitters. So parents, please supervise your children. This will help to ensure everyone's safety and enjoyment.

Restricted Fire Season.

The fire season normally doesn't start until after Guy Fawkes. However, the Waitakere City Council introduced it early, several months ago because of the water crisis, and it will be in effect until the end of April 1995. What does this mean to you? It means that you need a permit for all outdoor fires apart from self contained barbecues. This means that rubbish fires and bonfires must have a fire permit - ring the Council, ph 836-8000. If the Fire Brigade is called to your bonfire and you don't have a permit, they must put it out - they have no discretion.

Firefighters Required

The Waiatarua Volunteer Fire Brigade needs reinforcements. Volunteer firefighters are (reasonably)

normal people with normal lives and normal jobs (eg drivers, office workers, mothers, engineers, gardeners, unemployed). They enjoy the opportunity to contribute to their community while learning useful skills and (it must be said) getting a few thrills and excitement along the way. Full training and uniform supplied. No pay. We would love to hear from you if this sounds like you.
