OBITUARY

- Ian Wells -

Waiatarua lost one of it's true personalities on the morning of Sunday 21 July. Ian Wells died peacefully in Auckland Hospital from cancer at the young age of 48.

Originally from Wanganui, Ian moved to Waiatarua in the mid – 1970's as ARA caretaker at the Upper Nihotupu Dam. In the following years he made his mark in virtually every aspect of life in our community. He was active in the Waiatarua Theatre, in the Ratepayers and Residents Association for many years and 1989 – 1992 was a Waitakere City Councillor for the Waitakere ward. His association with the Auckland Regional Authority (later Council) continued, and at the time of his death he was a specialist Park Ranger based at Arataki.

Soon after he came to live here, lan joined the Waiatarua Volunteer Fire Brigade and for the next twenty years was vigorously active in all areas in the Brigade. After one (obviously inspiring) weekend at a Fire Service training course he announced on the following Brigade night that he intended "to turn you Wallys into a first class firefighting force". As a result, he immediately earned for himself the nickname "Wally" or "Wal". He was an excellent firefighter and Station Officer, competed in the inaugural World Firefighter Games in Auckland in 1990, and on 22 July 1995 became the first Life Member of the Brigade.

lan's funeral services at Titirangi Fire Station and Morrison's were a true celebration of his life. One of the tributes was "THE MAN OF MANY HATS", read by members of the Fire Brigade. It first appeared in this newsletter about six years ago and is reprinted again in this issue.

We extend our love and sympathy to lan's wife Cathy, his children Kyleigh, Levon and Susan, sister Bronwyn and brothers Sandy and Simon.

Stepped Differential Rating

Following a recent successful challenge in the High Court the Waitakere City Council has reversed a decision to keep the current rating system which was so unfair to a small minority of ratepayers throughout the City with highly-valued properties.

The stepped differential rating system now adopted means rate rises to some ratepayers of 38% but this is still far less than under the old system.

Chuck Humphrey and Richard Hoyle from Waiatarua R&R Assn were among about 60 representatives of Rate-payer Associations who went to a protest meeting at the Sunnyvale Hall organised by the Sunnyvale Ratepayers Association. The stated intention of this meeting was to organise a public meeting to protest against the adoption of stepped differential rating, but in this the Sunnyvale people were unsuccessful since an obvious majority at the meeting favoured accepting the High Court decision (as if there were any option!!).

The meeting passed a motion to tell the Waitakere City Council to drop any idea of an appeal to the Court of Appeal against the High Court decision.

The most positive outcome was an obvious wish from all present to reduce the rate burden to everyone in the City, and to organise a meeting to discuss all forms of rating with the intention of adopting, for an extended period, the fairest system for ALL ratepayers.
