

NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

We have a new group in our area! Daniel Muller, 550 Scenic Drive, phone 814-8998, is the co-ordinator, so please give him a call if you wish to be part of his group.

I cannot emphasise enough that if something does happen on or near your property your first action must be to telephone 111 and advise the police. Your safety comes first and they are the ones with the expertise. Your neighbourhood watch group is the second telephone call you should make and they will see what they can do to help you.

We have had an instance this month where one of our neighbours had a car drive up their right-of-way and back away very quickly when they saw someone in the house. The car had been stolen, but a burglary was prevented. Please be careful. Work out a plan of action for yourself if something like this happens so that you know exactly what you are going to do and who you can call. Know who is at home in your close vicinity who you can alert and can help in getting a registration number or descriptions. I can't emphasise enough that you must always telephone the police first. They are n the best position to help and that is what they are there for. Neighbourhood watch is not a replacement of this facility but is there to add their help and support to that already available.


New members always welcome!

WAIATARUA FIRE BRIGADE

The Volunteer Fire Brigade will pause to reflect on Monday 21st July, as we mark our first year in the last two decades without Ian Wells. Many of you will remember "The Man of Many Hats", not just for his involvement at the Fire Station where he was our first Life Member. He also left his mark with the ARC, Drama Club, Ratepayers Association and as a City Councillor. It will be Ian's shout that night.

We've had a number of calls during weekday working hours lately. This poses a problem for us in turning out the fire appliance, as more often than not we don't have a full crew in Waiatarua at that time. The Fire Controlroom know this – it's common to many Volunteer Brigades – and respond an additional appliance from the city in case we can't turn out. However, a number of us work in Henderson and are able to respond from there. You can help us. If you see a car behind you on the road with headlights and hazard lights on during the day, please let it pass. Chances are it's one of your local volunteer firefighters responding to a fire call. Although we must still obey all the laws of the road when we travel to the station, we can still often make a difference with a delayed response.

And you'll have read of the recent avoidable tragedies in a number of house fires. If you haven't got around to getting your smoke alarm yet, all it needs is a phone call. We can deliver them, advise on installation, and even install them if you like. All for just the cost of the smoke alarm.
