BUSY YEAR FOR WAIATARUA FIRE BRIGADE

An unusual number of fire calls has seen 1997 as the busiest year in the history of the Brigade, with calls up by over 40% on previous years. The increase is attributed to a spate of bush fires over the last few weeks and a high number of car fires in the area.

A recent addition to the Brigade is a First Response Vehicle which was purchased as a result of the Brigade Fund raising efforts. The vehicle will carry initial fire fighting equipment, and will generally be used at incidents involving long driveways that are inaccessible to the fire engine. It will carry first aid equipment and can be used as a personnel carrier to calls where extra fire fighters are needed.

Three Fire Brigade members have received certificates for passing Fire Service examinations. The Brigade now has two "members" and one "fellow" of the New Zealand Fire Brigade Institute.

Brigade members have also received passes in the arduous breathing apparatus courses and other fire fighting courses at the Mount Wellington training centre.

The on-going fundraising continues next year with the inception of a new play starting in April. It is written and produced by the Fire Brigade and already considerable interest is being shown from patrons who saw the last two performances of "Phone 1125 J" and "Les Pompiers". It's about a young man who gets mixed up with a ventriloquists dummy and has the risque' title of "Red hat no knickers". Would anybody who may be able to help out either on or off stage give the station a ring on Monday nights 814-9213 around 7.30 pm.
