
After much research and consultation with heating experts about the most efficient and cost effective heating for the hall area, your committee ordered new heaters.

SUN 3rd, 3:11 pm - Fuel leaking after a car accident, Piha Rd.

## Weed of the Month

#### Wild Ginger

Our most "famous" weed. It was "Ginger-out" campaigns in the 1980's which raised public awareness of the threat posed by introduced plants to our native bush. Our own Ratepayers Association organised a government-sponsored work gang to clear ginger from roadsides and public areas, but if we don't keep up the fight the problem will be back just as severely as before. The large scented yellow flowers of the widespread Kahili ginger and the less common creamy Yellow ginger are prominent from now until April. Beds of living rhizomes can form a dense layer up to a metre thick.

In the bad old days, the only way to get of wild ginger was to dig out every piece of root. That's still effective on small clumps. But the introduction of the herbicide Escort meant that complete control is now feasible without weeks of back-breaking work. Escort should be mixed at 2.5 grams per 5 litres water plus 10 mls of a spreader/sticker like Pulse. Garden centres sell small packs, but you may need to go to somewhere like Veg-Gro (Westgate) or Wrightsons (Kumeu) for larger packs. Unfortunately it's not cheap. The most efficient and economic method of control is to cut and clear away part of the stalk leaving 2 or 3 leaves, and spray what's left including the rhizome immediately. You'll see results in 3 months, but you should leave it for a year or so to dry out completely if you want to remove it. You can safely replant amongst the dead roots.

#### Agapanthus

It's a really good idea to cut the flower heads off and dispose of them before they drop their seeds

A new child health initiative has been started in West Auckland called WestKids, it is a joint venture between Waitemata DHB, Pasifica Fono, Wai-Health, Plunket, Integrated Primary Care Services (which includes most West Auckland GP's) and Starship Hospital. There were concerns regarding the number of West Auckland children being admitted to Starship Hospital. WestKids provides follow up care, family/whanau support services, and coordination of well child checks. WestKids also has a strong focus on analysis of local child health needs in order to identify ways of providing better health care for our children.

#### West Auckland Youth Services (WAYS)

WAYS is a drop in centre where YOUTH can be themselves. It is a joint venture between Te Whanau O Waipareira and Pasifica and is situated at 3 Montel Avenue, Henderson. WAYS aims to empower and support RANGATAHI/YOUTH to reach their full potential socially, mentally, physically, culturally and spiritually.

### Painted Apple Moth Update (PAM)

Recent finds in the Scenic Ranges of PAM indicate that the moth may have begun to infest the ranges. MAF estimate that PAM could cost forests, horticulture and the environment \$48 million over the next 20 years. However the impact on conservation areas such as the Waitakere Ranges is not known because although PAM is known to feed on Kowhai and Ribbonwood, MAF have yet to carry out host plant trials that include all our native species.

MAF is setting up a health monitoring and support services as part of the eradication programme for PAM. MAF have set up an information line for the community to access information and advice free of charge. The number is 0800 96 96 96.

It is an inner city subtropical garden with Bromeliads, Taro, Ferns and Palms and featuring other foliage plants. Kevin also produces designer ceramics, which are available for sale, and many of you will have seen around town the irresistible ceramic pukeko.

### February Garden Calendar

- · Keep dead heading perennials to prolong flowering
- Take semi hardwood cuttings of native plants such as Coprosma, Hebe, Olearia.
- Shorten back straggly Lavender and Abutilon after flowering and take cuttings
- To help keep passion vine hoppers at bay, spray with jets of water or Pyrethrum.
- When it is humid water in the mornings to reduce moisture on the leaves at night.
- It is not too late to plant Carrots, Silver Beet, Beetroot, Leeks and Winter Greens.

# **Jetstream Maybe?**
