Weedfree Waitakere to Run Five-Week Weed War

War on Weeds is to run for five weeks this year so Waitakere residents have plenty of opportunity to do major invasive weed clearing from their properties and get rid of their weeds in free jumbo bins at high-profile sites around the city. Traditionally held in March, War on Weeds will be from Monday 5th March until Easter Monday 10th April, 2007. This year it's being administered by Weedfree Waitakere Trust, a co-Trust of Keep Waitakere Beautiful Trust which has run the event for a number of years. War on Weeds is run in partnership with Waitakere City Council and in conjunction with Auckland Regional Council.

The Weedfree Waitakere Trust's Community Coordinator, Neil Henderson, believes War on Weeds is one of the big annual events on local gardeners' calendars with hundreds of tonnes of invasive weeds being removed from private properties in recent years.

He says, "During War on Weeds we focus on ridding Waitakere City of the 'nine nasty' weeds, but there are dozens of noxious weed varieties in our environment and they can be dumped in the bins as well. Our aim is for all of us to get rid of as many fast spreading weed invaders from our gardens as possible.

Things like ginger, blue morning glory, Arum lilies and convolvulus are all in flower at the moment so they're easy to spot. It's important to get these and other weeds before they fruit (go to seed). For example, woolly nightshade can become a small tree capable of spreading thousands of seeds in a very short time.

Climbing asparagus has become a nightmare, in Titirangi especially. It's generating lots of berries at this time so keep an eye out for it because if you don't the birds will.

Agapanthus has an uncertain status as a weed in Waitakere and in some areas it's getting out of control. If you want to get rid of the plants, dig them out; otherwise de-head promptly after flowering (and before seeding) and that will keep them under control.

The War on Weeds campaign is a great time to attack these weeds and take pride in doing our personal bit to protect our environment."

Neil stresses that in order to best utilise the free jumbo bins, no woody weeds (eg bamboo) or trees should be placed in the bins during War on Weeds. Weedfree Waitakere Trust can help with the disposal of these weeds by offering vouchers for the Transfer Station.

The 'nine nasties' are ginger, moth plant, smilax, Tradescantia (wandering jew), blue morning glory, japanese honeysuckle, plectranthus, jasmine and climbing asparagus.

Weedfree Waitakere Trust also offers a service where residents with major weed infestations on their properties can receive a site visit and detailed advice on managing the problem.

Waitakere Getting Tough on Illegal Dumping

Waitakere City Council is asking the public to take a tough stance against people illegally dumping rubbish in the city, which has increased by about 30% on previous years.

Councillor Janet Clews says the problem of illegal dumping has massively grown recently, coinciding with Waitakere's inorganic rubbish collections.

"The council has been finding as soon as residents place their inorganic rubbish on the kerb side that people, often from outside the city, come in and dump their rubbish right in the middle of it," Councillor Clews says.

"That is grossly unfair on the people whose streets are being turned into a regional tip, and it is also unfair to all ratepayers who between them have to pay the costs of collecting it."

Councillor Clews says the council wants to stop the illegal dumping but it needs the public's help.

"We have people sifting by hand through the suspected illegal dumps looking for vital pieces of information such as names and addresses, however, this is often insufficient for a successful prosecution."

"We need the public to provide us with descriptions of the dumpers and registration numbers too - if people could take photographs that would be brilliant," she says.

Councillor Clews says that unless stopped, the cost of this level of illegal dumping could threaten the future of Waitakere's inorganic collections.

The council has council officers specifically looking for offenders and has recently installed hidden cameras to detect offenders, who will be prosecuted and face a maximum fine of up to \$20,000.

This month we've drafted our Annual Plan for 2007/8. We've identified our biggest hazard – traffic – and managing this problem will be a higher priority at incidents. We've also changed the way we organised our training programmes, aligning them more closely with the highly structured Training and Progression system introduced by the Fire Service.

Recent calls:

10:53 am, Tue 6 Feb – Car crash, Piha Rd. The driver of one car died when two cars collided head-on, and the other was cut out of her overturned 4WD with serious injuries. The crew on the rescue tender felt that the first victim would almost certainly have survived and probably wouldn't have been too badly hurt IF she had been wearing her seatbelt.

3:14 pm, Sat 17 Feb – Scrub fire Piha Rd. Two young guys did a great job of just about beating the small fire out with a beach towel. We just had to damp it down and avoid the idiots hooning around a blind corner towards us.

4:25 pm, Sun 18 Oct – False alarm, Piha Rd.

10:22 pm, Sun 18 Feb – Petrol spill after crash, Piha. Handled by Piha crew.

2:42 pm, Sat 24 Feb – Scrub fire, Piha. One house was briefly threatened and about 1000 square metres of grass and scrub burnt before crews from Piha, Waiatarua, Karekare and Glen Eden brought it under control.

New Eco Design Advisory Service at Waitakere

Waitakere is offering a free 'eco design advice' service for people planning to build or renovate their homes.

Eco design advisor Fred Braxton can give impartial advice on sustainable design topics such as energy, water and materials for home building or renovation projects within the city's boundaries. Clients can make an appointment to meet him for up to two hours at their own site, at their designer's office or at the council - Waitakere Central, Henderson. The position, which is being trialed by Waitakere in association with BRANZ, aims to make better use of resources.

Braxton acknowledges that people are seriously considering environmental issues in their homes because they want to improve the health of their family, save money on energy and water bills, be more comfortable and reduce their impact on the environment.

"They can have a more satisfying environment to live in, and probably increase the re-sale value of the house," Braxton says.

He provides independent, factual, and practical building information on reducing energy bills, improving thermal performance, reducing water use, better waste management, careful material choices and improved indoor air quality. He has access to a large support network of specialists, design tools, assessment methods, and materials information - all free. Not only homeowners but also designers and other building professionals can use the service.

For either a new build or a renovation, the best time to make use of Braxton's skills is at the preliminary design stage after any planning constraints have been identified.

The service is currently provided at only three councils in New Zealand, for a trial period of ten months - Hamilton, Kapiti Coast and Waitakere.

Annual Plan Deliberations Begin

Waitakere City Council has begun deliberations on its Draft Annual Plan (budget) for 2007/08.

Annual Plan Special Committee chairperson, Janet Clews, says that councillors will initially be examining the "first cut" of recommended work plans and budgets, and the outcomes will form the Draft Annual Plan and budget that is offered for public submissions.

"During this process we will be considering recommendations from the council, community boards and the chief executive. It is important that the public know this is the second year of the Long Term Council Community Plan (LTCCP) which we adopted last year. This means that nearly all the work is already programmed, consulted and agreed upon; and this is mainly a fine tuning exercise. It is also important that the public realise the council will be doing everything possible to reach a balance between the lowest possible rates while not sacrificing public services," says Councillor Clews.

The council is scheduled to adopt the Draft Annual Plan on March 2nd for public consultation. Public submissions will open on Monday 26th March and close on Friday 27th April. At a meeting on February 20th, councillors discussed an urgent item regarding any possible financial contribution for an upgrade to Eden Park for the 2011 Rugby World Cup. While the council has not formally been asked to contribute funding for this, it resolved that if any such request were received from the Government it would consult with residents (during the Annual Plan process) before making a decision.

While the Annual Plan sets the council's budget for the coming financial year the LTCCP outlines the direction and spending intentions for the coming ten years.

Submission forms will be available in the April issue of the Waitakere News, on the council web site www.waitakere.govt.nz at the Civic Centre, service centres and libraries.
