Chemical Dumping

A disturbing recent trend has been the dumping of chemical waste in the Ranges, probably discarded from a 'P' lab. In both of the incidents in the last month there were a number of different containers, some unlabelled, and some containing a quantity of chemicals. We're told some of these can be pretty nasty – especially if they mix.

Please call the Police or Fire Service if you see anything like this and don't try to clean them up yourself. If you see them being dumped and can safely note vehicle registration numbers or descriptions than the Police would certainly appreciate this information (immediately if possible), but don't put yourself at risk!

FOCUS ON BUSINESS

One of the great joys in my life is being able to work from my office that looks straight out into our beautiful Waiatarua bush. Perhaps you are one of my fellow locals who do the same, or maybe you've thought about starting your own business so you can! If so, this month's column is for you.

As the *Focus on Business* interviews have shown over the past five months, the shape and diversity of small businesses in Waiatarua is huge. Our peaceful, exquisitely beautiful landscape is full of the most amazing entrepreneurs, all of whom have demonstrated their commitment to our community by basing their businesses here. These self-employed and small business owners are a cornerstone of our community. Without them, we would have considerably fewer resources available for the not-for-profit organisations and activities that operate in Waiatarua. Many small business owners employ or outsource to others in the community, and also invest their time and expertise to contribute directly. There is a certain level of expectation that local businesses will support the communities in which they operate, which is fine – but who supports them?

Anyone who has ever started up their own business will tell you that it can be a pretty overwhelming experience, and it doesn't necessarily get any easier as the business continues to grow. Decisions need to be made and actions to be taken that may be well outside the expertise of the business owner, and there's always something new to learn to stay on top of things. In addition, despite what many may think, a large number of (even quite successful) small businesses make only a modest profit; even for those operating from home, as so many do in Waiatarua, there are hidden costs associated with running a profitable business.

Fortunately, there's now good news for small business owners when they need support. Over the last couple of years, there has been an explosion of information, services and resources available to help anyone operating their own business, or thinking about starting one. While there are always times when we need to pay a professional for services, there are now also many quality services available absolutely free – you just have to know where to look! Many of these are particularly useful for people thinking of starting up or in the early stages of their business – it's a bit of a 'catch 22' – you need the services and resources in order to have the money to pay for them! Here are just a couple of my favourite resources for small business owners or those looking to start one, accessible right here in our own community.

Enterprise Waitakere: Telephone 837 1855 or email businessservices@waitakereenterprise.co.nz; Website www.waitakereenterprise.co.nz; Offices – Second Floor, Central One, Waitakere Central Office Park, 4 Henderson Valley Road, Henderson.

Enterprise Waitakere exists to help businesses in the area succeed. They offer practical support and assistance to existing business owners or those considering starting a business. Their range of services includes a Business Start-up Pack (they'll post it to you, or you can collect) a range of free courses, funding opportunities, and contacts to help grow your business.

New Zealand Trade and Enterprise: Telephone 0800 55 5888; Website www.nzte.govt.nz New Zealand Trade and Enterprise provides a huge range of information and tools to help start, run or grow a business.

Biz: Telephone 0800 424 946; Website www.business.govt.nz; Offices – Waitakere Enterprise Biz is a fairly new service provided by NZTE; in Waitakere their physical services are offered via Enterprise Waitakere, so you can 'phone them or pay them a visit if you're not on the internet. If you are, the website is new, and superb! I highly recommend it.

There are many other quality free resources available to support small business owners or those thinking about starting up a business, from business planning, information on how to set up your business and home office, business and computer training, and business mentoring, to free computer software that you can use to run your business records (and information on what records you should keep, and how to keep them!). Recycling Days

NOVEMBER 14th & 28th

Place your recycling bin and bundled paper on the kerb by 7:30am on your recycling collection day.

Last month it was stated that only #1 and #2 plastics were to be placed in the recycling bin. This is the official Council policy; but one of our community has communicated with Jon Roscoe at the Council and unofficially they will take plastics #1, #2, #3, #4, #5, #6 and #7. The reason it is not policy yet is that they aren't sure if the market will continue to exist (although it seems pretty likely) and they don't want to have to tell everyone to go back to #1 and #2s, so people who put out #1 to #7s need to be mindful that they may possibly be asked to stop the #3 to #7s sometime in the future. If anyone in Waiatarua wishes to discuss this further then they are welcome to phone Jon Roscoe at the WCC who is aware that we will be putting this in our newsletter.
