This month Station Officer Gareth Mullins, Fire Police Louisa Ferguson and our Volunteer Support Officer Mike Barrett, have worked hard to carry out Building Risk assessments in the area, to help create risk plans for non residential buildings.

A big "Thank You" to all those who took the time to speak to us, and help us with relevant information.

Qualified Fire-Fighter Derek Renata attended a Fire Service OSH Training Day this month. Keep up the good work Derek. The brigade at the moment is focusing the weekly training on core competencies.

Fire Safety

All of your family needs to understand an escape plan and to practise escaping from each room in the house by the two exits.

Most fires start in kitchens (25%), bedrooms (13%), and lounges and family rooms (16%). Make sure your family practises escaping from these rooms every three to six months.

Remember, you need to:

- · Have working smoke alarms
- · Know two ways out of every room if possible
- Make sure that doors and windows needed for escape are clear and easy to open, and that there is a safe way to reach the ground from upper floors.
- · Keep keys in deadlocks at all times when home
- · Have an outside meeting place, such as a letterbox or a special tree
- · Make special plans for young children and older people.

It's important to have Properties clearly marked with street numbers so your house can easily be identified in case of emergency.

If possible get someone to stand at the entrance to the driveway to direct emergency services to the correct address.
