Interested In Becoming A Fire Fighter?

Waiatarua Volunteer Fire Brigade is always looking for willing people to come on board. Fire Fighters, Fire Police and Operational support members are needed. Volunteers can be women or men from any walk of life. Volunteers include students, self-employed, mothers at home, shift-workers, trades people and professionals. They are people who care about their community and want to be actively involved. You must be at least 18 years old, fit and healthy and available to attend weekly Monday night training nights and preferably, live within close proximity to the fire station.

Operation Spring Clean 2009

It's time to start rallying your team for the annual Operation Spring Clean.

Litter and graffiti send a signal that no one cares. Every year residents, schools and community groups come together to turn this around by cleaning up a chosen part of their neighbourhood such as a stream, reserve, street or local beach. The result is a cleaner, greener environment as well as a renewed sense of pride and ownership for the residents. Cleaning up these areas also acts as a deterrent for further illegal dumping. Keep Waitakere Beautiful Trust, in partnership with Waitakere City Council, makes this possible by providing registered individuals, groups and schools with the resources that they need to make it happen, such as rubber gloves, bags and bins. The disposal of the collected waste is at no cost to the groups.

In 2009 the Trust is trying out a new approach to the disposal of waste collected during the annual event. A trial is being undertaken to reduce the amount of waste that ends up at landfill by providing participating schools with a bin to sort recyclable waste into. The recycling trial is optional for schools that enroll, but with around 30 schools participating each year, the Trust expects to see great results from this approach.

The target for this year is 20,000 participants. So if you have an area that you would like to see spruced up, start getting your troops together now.
