The Arataki Rangers Roundup

Spring seemed to have crept up and then retreated rather quickly this last month. Heavy rains have seen many staff and track crews attending to the repair of track surfaces and drains. Tree falls too have been cleared as a priority. Our thanks to those that have informed us of these issues in areas of the Park that we may not have got to yet! The popu-

lar Zig Zag Track at Titirangi Beach has a track crew extending culverts and repairing steps. This will be welcome news to all those that use this track in accessing Titirangi Beach through spectacular bush.

What a busy time on the coast! Earlier in the month a bottle nose dolphin beached itself at Mill Bay but despite the best efforts of locals, Department of Conservation Staff and Rangers, it could not be saved. This was upsetting for everyone involved but the cooperation and goodwill experienced on that rainy night was much appreciated. A boat ran aground at Whatipu but was successfully re-floated several days later. This again involved a large and coordinated response in order to prevent any environmental impact to the area. And to close our coastal files, a green turtle that appeared on Whatipu Beach is now convalescing at Kelly Tarlton's. Thanks again to all the reports we received from observant park users.



I. Local Boards

- · One Board to include the whole of the Waitakere Ranges Heritage Area (WRHA), which must not be split up.
- · Effective & consistent management of the Heritage Area will be compromised if it is split.
- This Board could also include other areas not currently within the WRHA, but which share its community of interest, e.g.. Muriwai, Waitakere Village etc.
- · What is it that your community identifies itself with (bush, beach, wilderness, small community, rural etc)?

There were other concerns raised but a lot of the concern is really about not yet knowing quite what is going to happen with a lot of speculation so we will follow progress with great interest.

Frank Hogsden kindly agreed to draft the submission for us and I am grateful to Frank for this

We have also made a submission to the Waitakere City Council regarding their proposed new community leases policy, pointing out some of the anomalies in this document especially for halls like ours which is predominately a community facility and would not be feasible with the proposed increased lease fees. Fortunately we have applied for the five year right of renewal as per our current lease so things should stay as they are.

John Stagg handled the submission for this so as you can see we all pitch in.

Another highly successful Quiz night was held on the 10^{th} October with 55 keen people ready to test their brain power, thanks once again to lan Ford and Cathie Wells for the fantastic job of collating all the questions and acting as quiz masters.

If you haven't been to one yet, do yourself a favour and look out for the next one.

By the time you read this, the latest play from our drama club will be about to open at the hall and once again will provide you with an enjoyable night out with a laugh or two guaranteed. So all in all it has been an interesting few weeks which brings Xmas closer and closer.

Fireworks Fire Safety

If you are not planning to attend the Community Bonfire or public Displays then please remember:

Only one person should be in charge of fireworks. If that's you, then make sure you take all the necessary precautions.

Read the instructions in daylight and don't drink any alcohol until they've all been discharged. Make your preparations in advance, and in daylight. On the night, you will need...

- · A torch.
- · A bucket or two of water.
- · Eye protection and gloves.
- · A bucket of soft earth to put fireworks in.
- · Suitable supports and launchers if you're setting off Catherine wheels or rockets.

Protect your animals.

You should take precautions to protect your pets during, before and after Guy Fawkes, make sure they are safely inside and safe when fireworks are being let off.
