

New local publisher celebrates Karekare book

"I realised this is truly a rich gem, a legacy of not only remote Karekare beach, but a grand story of this country. Wally speaks in a voice that reflects the time; a time that is now rapidly fading in memory and people."



Restricted Fire Season

Fire Permits

Remember that from the 1st December until the end of April you MUST have a fire permit from the Council to light any outdoor fires. You can get these from the Council at no charge, but you must apply at least 3 working days before you want your fire. The Fire Brigade does not issue permits. More details here: www.waitakere.govt.nz/abtcit/cp/ruralfire.asp

How do I get a Fire Permit?

To obtain a fire permit contact Waitakere City Council on 837 0790 Monday to Friday between 8.30am and 5pm. A site inspection by a Council Rural Fire Officer is required before any fire can be lit. Permits will not be issued outside of Council business hours.

Note: A lead-time of three (3) working days is required for the issuing of all permits.

To assist the Rural Fire Officer conducting the inspection, the following general conditions must be met before a permit will be issued:

- · Fire must be supervised at all times
- · Fire must be out by sunset each day
- · Fire must be 10 metres from any structure
- Fire must be 3 metres from any boundary
- . There must be a cleared area around the fire site
- There must be a means (water etc) present to control the fire
- . The fire must not present a nuisance to oth-

There is no charge for the issue of fire permits.

For those tramping stalwarts in the know, this is essentially a reroute of the old Slip Track (an aptly named track at that!). This will fit into the bigger picture of the recently announced Hillary Trail enabling trampers to depart on a multi day walking experience from the Arataki Visitor Centre.

As if that wasn't enough excitement for Arataki, another successful Arataki Kids Day was well attended. Thanks must go to the Friends of Arataki for their inspiration and role of coordinating the event. Appreciation must also go to the Waiatarua Volunteer Fire Brigade, the Titirangi Orpheus Scouts and Brian Lawton (aka 'The Bugman'). There were also many individuals whose help was invaluable in a day enjoyed by over 1200 happy attendees.

The Arataki Nursery received a boost from a BNZ corporate volunteer group who after bagging up over 1500 plants for half a day, then threw themselves into some track work on Rangemore Track. For those not in the know, this short crescent walk opposite Greenwoods Corner hosts some spectacular podocarps. Get in there and enjoy it!
