## Kauri Dieback: ARC update

as Phytobhthora taxon agathis (or PTA) was identified as a new disease to science and major threat to kauri in May 2008.

Since that time, the ARC has worked to assess the extent of the disease and minimise further spread on regional parkland and private land within the Auckland region.

What causes kauri dieback?

PTA is believed to be an introduced disease which infects kauri of all ages through the root system.

Kauri dieback disease, also known PTA is a fungus-like disease that is spread in soil and water via two different forms of spores. The soil-borne spores have a hard outer shell that allows survival in soil and transportation within soil on equipment (for example footwear, earthmoving machinery), while the water-borne spores have a small tail which allows movement through water (catchments or water films in soil) to other areas of

> Infected kauri can show a range of symptoms including yellowing leaves, thinning canopy, dead branches, bleeding lesions forming collars around the lower trunks and sudden death.

What else can cause kauri to decline?

Other factors that can cause a decline in the health of kauri include living 'on the edge' (unprotected by other trees), lack of water or 'wet feet', strong winds, soil compaction, disease and root disturbance. If no gum can be seen on the lower trunk of a sickly kauri, it may be suffering from one of these stressors.

#### What you can do to help

- · Make sure shoes, tyres and equipment are clean of dirt before and after visiting kauri forest.
- · Clean shoes and any other equipment that comes into contact with soil after every visit, especially if moving between bush areas.
- · Keep to defined park tracks at all times. Any movement of soil around the roots of a tree has the potential to spread the disease.
- · Keep your dog on a leash at all times. Dogs can inadvertently spread the disease if they disturb the soil around the trees.

PTA spores cannot be eradicated once they are introduced into an area of kauri and may survive for many years in the soil. Research is currently under way into boosting the immune response of kauri to fight off infection.

#### What we are doing on ARC parks

Although a few low traffic/low kauri density tracks in the Waitakere Ranges are yet to be surveyed, a comprehensive picture of the extent of kauri dieback in this park has been developed.

3854 kauri along tracks throughout the Waitakere Ranges Regional Park were surveyed. Of these, 772 trees exhibited symptoms of PTA. Some diseasefree areas were also found within the Waitakere Ranges track network.

In order to contain the disease, phytosanitary measures have been developed to minimise the movement of spores into, away from and within parkland.

Approximately 80 crates with spray bottles and hand-held scrub brushes are being placed at track ends and on each side of healthy zones of kauri in the Waitakere Ranges.

These cleaning stations are used to clean soil from footwear before and after entering the track network.

The ARC is currently working to re-route some tracks away from kauri root zones and upgrade current tracks to minimise contact with kauri roots.

The ARC and the University of Auckland are collaborating on research into PTA detection within streams and the role of feral pigs in vectoring the disease.

The ARC has trebled its feral pig culling programme in the Waitakere Ranges, based on the high likelihood that pigs are involved in the spread of this disease. To date, more than 500 pigs have been culled in two years. A further round of pig control is currently under way.

#### What we are doing on private land

Site visits were made in response to all public/landowner reports of sick or dead kauri trees.

A total of 240 sites have been inspected within the Auckland Region.

Sites with kauri dieback have been found throughout the Auckland region; however the greatest concentration of these sites to date is in West Auckland, particularly the Titirangi area.

Public awareness and footwear and equipment hygiene is essential to minimise further spread of the disease on private land.

### The Arataki Rangers roundup

A busy and sunny summer holiday period has seen high visitor numbers through the Arataki Visitor Centre and especially out to the west coast beaches. This seasonal increase has seen many people renewing their connection to these wild places whilst others are 'cutting their teeth' with some blistering black sand experiences! Unfortunately Parks staff were involved with two events that were needless. The first was a bush fire at North Piha that had staff scrambling for several days in steep terrain, ignited by a rescue flare fired in New Year celebrations. The second was the loss of a rock fisherman, again at Piha. Despite an active education campaign on rock fishing safety in the area, this unlucky fisher climbed down the rocks to retrieve a stuck line and was swept out to sea. He was not wearing a life jacket.

On a considerably brighter note, staff had the satisfaction of the official launch of the Hillary Trail. This 70km, four day walk from Arataki to Swanson or Muriwai has been years in the planning and development. Opened on the second anniversary of the loss of Sir Ed, this track celebrates both the man and the rugged and varied terrain that he loved to visit. Fittingly, the track is challenging in nature and requires a mix of experience and self sufficiency. Please call the Arataki visitor centre for more details, or swing by and collect the brochure specific to this trail. Bookings are required for campsites. One positive spin-off is that all you tramping diehards who fondly remember the Slip Track (an aptly named park asset that accessed Pipeline Track and Pipeline Road), which started 200m West of the Visitor Centre, can now enjoy the re-routed Slip Track. This 'make-over' represents the current start of the Hillary Trail. It now begins behind the Visitor Centre itself, 50m up the Lookout Track. Just follow the distinctive Hillary trail markers - and enjoy!

The Arataki nursery is filling rapidly with seedlings that will be gradually 'toughened up' before the busy winter planting season. Volunteers, training groups and our student Rangers have put in many hours to see that we have the plant numbers and diversity to continue our park-wide planning.

That's all for this time around.
