New Year celebration causes fire at Piha

At four minutes past midnight on January I, 2010 the bells went down and Waiatarua Fire Brigade was on its way to a most spectacular bush fire at Piha. Most of the brigade members saw in the New Year at Piha beach watching the whole hillside at the north end of Piha go up in flames.

Many brigades from surroundings areas were turned out to help battle the blaze, including Piha, Titirangi, Glen Eden and rural brigades Karekare and Bethells. Unfortunately with all this manpower it was still impossible to reach the fire by ground to fight it.

A helicopter was brought in from SkyWorks and a helicopter pad was set up. Volunteers worked hard to shuttle water into the monsoon bucket. Water tankers came from Bethells Beach and Shelly Beach brigades and Whenuapai Air Base to provide extra water for the helicopter.

A team from Waiatarua was sent down Anawhata Road with the dubious task of visiting every house/bach to warn occupants of the raging fire creeping up the hill towards them.

Waiatarua was sent home at about 3.45am and Karekare Brigade stood down about 4am, but was asked to go back at 6.30am, with Bethells Brigade standing by to monitor the fire.

The purpose of this write up is to illustrate the damage that one firework/flare can do. The matter is still under investigation by the Police, but from sources so far it has been ascertained that the fire was started by a parachute flare set off at midnight. The wind caught it and carried it into the dry bush on the hillside.

One thoughtless act by someone cost a whole hillside of native bush, a sleepless night for about 40 volunteer firefighters and a bill of upwards of \$20,000. The cost could be presented to the individual who set off the flare, it may turn out to be a very costly new year celebration.

Environmental Report

It has been perfect weather for digging out ginger and other environmental weeds. A lot of you are working very hard at doing this as the weed bin at the Waiatarua Fire Station is now being emptied every week or two.

If you are not up to removing your ginger and agapanthus plants, it is really important that you remove the flower heads before they set seeds and put these in the bin.

From 1st March there will be an extra weed bin located on West Coast Road by Kauri Loop Road. This is for the War on Weeds campaign which lasts until 31st March.

Please remember these bins are for environmental weeds only, particularly ginger, wandering jew, jasmine, agapanthus, climbing asparagus and plectranthus, which seem to be most common weeds in our area. They are not for general garden waste. If you are unsure read the sign next to the bin.

We are very fortunate to have a weed bin to dispose of these weeds as pulling them out and leaving them in a pile will not kill them as they will just keep on growing. I have had success with covering a large pile of plectranthus with black polythene and after 4 months it was dead but this does not work with ginger roots or wandering jew.

Fire Brigade

Hi all! Hope you had a great new year. 2010 has been very eventful for the Waiatarua Fire Brigade so far.

Helen Longley has been appointed to the position of CFO. Interviews have now been done for the position of Deputy Chief Fire Officer. (This position became vacant with Helen moving into the Chief's role.) Outgoing Chief lan Ford has now moved into a Station Officer role.

Restricted Fire Season and Fire Permits

During the Restricted Fire Season, a permit is required to light any fire in the open air. The Restricted Fire Season is usually from 1 December to 30 April.

To obtain a fire permit contact the Waitakere City Council Monday to Friday between 8.30am and 5pm. A site inspection by a Council Rural Fire Officer is required before any fire can be lit. Permits will not be issued outside of Council business hours.

Rural Fire Officer must visit and view the proposed fire site before a permit can be issued. A permit cannot be issued over the phone.

The person whom the permit is made out to must be on site as the permit is to be handed to the person who wishes to have the fire.

Note: It requires 3 working days to issue a permit, however generally it will be arranged as soon as possible. The visiting Officer will arrange a specific time suitable to you to visit the site. This will be during the working hours of 8am to 5pm Monday to Friday.

To assist the Rural Fire Officer conducting the inspection, the following general conditions must be met before a permit will be issued:

- · Fire must be supervised at all times
- · Fire must be out by sunset each day
- Fire must be 10 metres from any structure
- Fire must be 3 metres from any boundary
- There must be a cleared area around the fire site
- There must be a means (water etc.) present to control the fire
- The fire must not present a nuisance to others

There is no charge for the issue of fire permits.

A fire permit is generally issued for one week; this is due to the uncertainty of our weather conditions. An extension of the permit can be arranged providing certain conditions are met. However any fire officer (including a New Zealand Fire Service Officer) can put out your fire if it is deemed a hazard or a nuisance to your neighbours.

Recent calls

21/11/09 00:25am - Motor Vehicle Accident, Piha Road. This was a severe crash with one person seriously injured. Piha Road was closed for quite some time while the occupants of the car were treated and the Serious Crash Unit carried out its investigation.

26/11/09 17:30pm - Car Fire, Vineyard Rd, Henderson. Waiatarua was called to assist the Henderson appliance, as the car was burning in a paddock and the Henderson truck was too large to gain access. However it was no problem for Waiatarua's little Mitzi.

26/11/09 19:10pm - Burst Water Main, Vineyard Rd, Henderson. As a result of corrosion the water main burst during use for the above car fire. Waiatarua Appliance relieved the pressure on the water main until the council could come and repair it.

10/12/09 20:10pm - Rubbish Fire, Scenic Drive, Waiatarua. A small amount of rubbish was deliberately lit.

28/12/09 09:25am - Fire Causing Concern, Tui Cres, Waiatarua. A non-permitted bonfire.

01/01/2010 00:01am - Fire Causing Concern, Karekare Rd, Karekare. The very first call of 2010 was another non permitted fire that was dealt with by the Karekare brigade.

01/01/2010 00:16am - Scrub Fire, Garden Rd, Piha. While on the way to the previous call Waiatarua was turned out to the Piha fire detailed on the front page.

06/01/10 20:40pm - Scrub Fire, The Cutting, Karekare. This was a camp fire that got a little big, it was dealt with by Karekare Fire Brigade.

10/01/10 19:30pm - Fire On Lion Rock, Piha. A small area of scrub on fire on lion rock. Piha brigade extinguished this using hand tools and a portable pump (after a bit of a climb).

23/01/10 12:51 - Person fallen off cliff, Pararaha Valley, Karekare. Piha, Karekare, Waiatarua and Henderson appliances called to assist Police, search and rescue, and ambulance staff to locate and move patient from bush.

07/02/10 02:03 - Car Fire, Scenic Drive.

07/02/10 18:49 - Car Over Bank, Piha Rd.

09/02/10 21:09 - Motorcycle off road, Scenic Dr.
