Passionate people wanted as Park Rangers

Are you passionate about your local park? Then join Waitakere City Council's Community Park Ranger programme.

Rangers are the eyes and ears

of the community, reporting to the council's parks team on anything from vandalism, graffiti and litter to educating the public on park use. They are also encouraged to build relationships with local people and groups to promote safer parks.

"We have almost 600 parks in Waitakere and it's impossible for our staff to be everywhere at once, so we want the community to let us know what's happening in their parks," says Councillor Brenda Brady.


"This could be a great way for families to do something together, a way for people to build stronger connections with their community and to meet new neighbours."

"If you love your parks and want to help, we want to hear from you."

The scheme encourages residents living near parks and people interested in taking on a more active role in their management.

The numbers of volunteer park rangers has declined recently as people move house or take on other commitments, so the council is looking to recruit fresh talent.

| Fire Brigade | Louisa Ferguson |

The brigade members have been busy this month. Well done to QFF Derek Ranata, QFF Shane Moore, FF Robert Forrest & FF Thomas Hopkins who attended a fire service Realistic Fire Training course in Whangarei. This was a full day course in which the fire fighters were exposed to real life fire in a training environment.

A big reminder of the importance of carrying a portable fire extinguisher in your car. On Wednesday the 31st of March, brigade members SO Gareth Mullins and QFF Derek Renata and FP Louisa Ferguson were called upon by neighbours and children waiting for the school bus on Forest Hill road, to a car on fire at the bus stop. They firstly confirmed that fire brigade was called and on the way. The fire in the car's engine compartment was extinguished using portable fire extinguishers and they cordoned off the area and directed traffic safely around the incident. A big thanks to these fire-fighters who used skills learned in the brigade to help contain the spread of fire and keep members of the public safe. Also many thanks to the members of the public who stopped to offer their assistance.

Winter Fires

Please ensure you have your chimneys swept before you start using your fire places.

With the abundance of wildlife in the hills, who knows what may have nested in your chimney over the summer months.

Every year far too many people face the tragedy of a fire in their home caused by hot ashes. The ash you clear from your fire place or wood burner can take up to five days to cool. Place these in a metal container well clear of your home.

Please remember the heater-metre rule – keep furniture, clothes and curtains at least one metre away from heaters and fire places. You should also turn off all heaters and your electric blanket before you get into bed.

18/03/2010 1:51am - Truck Fire Scenic Drive, Waiatarua. Local Water Supply truck parked at the side of the road was destroyed by a fire in the cab that appeared to be deliberately lit.

20/03/2010 5:36pm - Car Fire Scenic Drive, Waiatarua. At the Spragg Bush Reserve a car appears to have been driven through the chain onto the grass area and deliberately set on fire.

04/04/2010 4:56pm - Scrub on Fire, Piha Road, Waiatarua. Waiatarua, Karekare and Piha Brigades were called to a report of scrub on fire on Piha Road.

05/04/2010 11:22am - Smoke Causing Concern Forest Hill Road. Again another Non Permitted rubbish fire was creating excessive smoke and causing hazard and nuisance to neighbours.

14/4/2010 0607 - Tree Down, West Coast Rd Oratia. A fallen tree over power lines had the brigade close the road until the power was switched off and council contractor arrived.
