It was such a day enjoyed by the residents of Brabant Road, pupils from Oratia Primary School and Arataki staff several weeks ago. From the Treasurer

Hi Everyone,

I can't believe the beautiful weather we are having. It has been just fantastic. I can put up with chilly winter nights when the sky is so clear and full of stars and the days are cloudless, windless and sunny. It has been a delight to take our dog, Ash, out for walks. I am making the most of it whilst it lasts.

Talking of dogs, do you own a pet? If you do, remember that you must keep your dog on a lead in the bush. We would love to let Ash off to run free, but sadly this increases the chances that the disease endangering our Kauri will spread and, of course, any native wildlife he discovers would not last long. If you own a cat, the SPCA and Forest and Bird have put out guidelines for protecting native wildlife. These include keeping your cat indoors at night, including dawn and dusk, because this is when the hunting and prowling instinct of a cat is strongest and when birds are sitting on their nests. Ensure your cat is fed a balanced diet at regular times and fed indoors. Provide moving toys to help prevent boredom. You can prevent cats from climbing to bird nests by putting animal guards around any trees in your garden that may have nesting birds.

Forest and Bird also have suggestions for how to encourage birds into your garden including by building a bird feeder. More information is on their website, http://www.forestandbird.org.nz/saving-our-environment/make-bird-feeder-your-garden. I plan to have a go at building one and will report back. I would be interested in hearing what others have done to encourage native birds into their garden.

In June we had a full house for the annual Great Debate. We had a great evening, the good company of fellow Waiataruans and their friends, good food and lively entertaining debaters. A big thank you to the debaters and the volunteers.

Wearing my Treasurer's hat I am happy to report that we made a small surplus from the evening. These events are put on for the enjoyment of the local community so we aim to make a small surplus so that we can continue to provide these events. Financially your society is in good heart. A quiet month for the Fire Brigade, with no fire calls since the last newsletter. The brigade has still been keeping busy with practices and training exercises.

This month saw the brigade receive funding from the Waitakere Licensing Trust for approximately \$8,000 for the purchase of new equipment including new rural fire fighting equipment, new torches and vehicle chargers for portable radio batteries. We again thank the Waitakere Licensing Trust for their support with over \$15,000 being donated to the West Auckland Fire Brigades.

Winter Fires

Every year, far too many people face the tragedy of a fire in their home caused by hot ashes. The ash you clear from your fire place or wood burner can take up to five days to cool. Place these in a metal container well clear of your home.

Please remember the heater-metre rule – keep furniture, clothes and curtains at least one metre away from heaters and fire places.

You should also turn off all heaters and your electric blanket before you get into bed.
