Letter to the Editor

Re Waiatarua drinking water....

..In over 75 years we've had almost nothing else than water from our own tanks, from the roofs.

At 831, we had about an 85 square metre roof feeding 1200 gallons (3 tanks) three boys, our parents and gardeners to wash for and this was before flush toilets came. Only the worst one or two droughts forced us to carry water about 330 metres from Potters Stream.

We emptied, bailed and swept out the leaves less often than yearly. Leaf buildup in spoutings will spill your precious fresh water, if you don't climb up and clean it out. (Don't disturb delicate spoutings) Toss out older leaves often from your spouting or use a good gutter protector system.

We had to bend chicken netting (about 18mm hexagons) in 2 or 3 layers, to exclude birds and rodents from getting into downpipes. I can personally testify that a dead possum, in an open tank, is to be avoided at all costs. It happened at Piha in about 1974. It did stink and was revolting and needed a very thorough cleanout

Last year, water trucked in cost \$200 for 10,000 litres with 10 days waiting!

Fire Brigade Report

This month we congratulate RFF Darren Gee for completion of his Fire Service recruit's course. He spent a week in Rotorua at The Fire Service National Training Centre, Training in Basic Firefighting, Vegetation fire fighting, BA and live fire training. Congratulations Fire Fighter Gee! Late May will see Recruit Firefighter Joseph Hardie attend the same course.

Fire Fighters from Waiatarua and around the country, and also from overseas, quickly filled the 400-plus places in the Fire Fighter Sky challenge on May 21st. They will climb the 1103 steps to the top of Auckland's Sky Tower in their full fire fighting kit in support the Leukaemia and Blood Foundation. Good luck to FF Thomas Hopkins & RFF Louisa Ferguson who will be braving the stairs this year.

Fire Safety

Being a new parent myself I thought that it's important to take a bit of time to consider our precious little ones coming into winter.

Children's Nightwear - New Fire Hazard Labelling

Whatever kind of nightwear a child is wearing, fire is still a serious risk. Children should stay at least one metre away from the heater or fire. Parents can choose safe nightwear for their child, but no clothes are fire-proof. When looking for safe nightwear, parents should choose the size that fits snugly. Baggy or loose nightwear can catch fire more easily.

Fire risk labels:

All children's nightwear needs to have a fire-risk label on it. From I April 2009, a red label means high fire danger, and a new orange label is a warning to choose close-fitting options. Other garments, such as those made of more fire resistant materials like wool blends, can still use the white Low Fire Danger label.

If parents are using or buying second-hand nightwear they should assume the nightwear is not heat or flame resistant whether the nightwear has a fire risk label or not.

Around the fire or heater

If a child is wearing high fire danger nightwear they should stay far away from the fire or heater. But even a 'low danger' label doesn't mean there is no danger. Nightwear that says 'low fire danger' can still catch fire if the child is too close.

If there are young children in the house, parents should put safety guards around the heater or fire. Parents should teach children the 'metre from the heater' rule.
