The Continuing Broadband Saga:

You and other residents may be interested to read the "response" I have just received (below) to my fault report to Telecom... and my further response... Terry Wilson

Hi Terry,

Thank you for your email. I'm sorry to hear you have been experiencing speed issues. We can certainly look into this for you. I do apologise also for the delay in this response, we have been experiencing high demand into our team but are working as quickly as possible to clear this.

I've reviewed your speed test results in conjunction with the case created at the broadband helpdesk. I've also run network checks across the connection. The exchange has already been investigated and a new ADSL2 capable exchange is being commissioned. I have been advised that we are awaiting a migration date, but there is no ETA on when this will occur.

It is not an easy changeover to implement and involves every connection hosted through the current exchange being moved over and the link into the core network being rebuilt which will require other contractors to dig and relay new cabling down. As you can imagine it will take some time for this to happen and unfortunately we do not have the timeframe surrounding this just yet. As soon as we have that information I will advise you of it.

I apologise for any inconvenience caused by this issue, I understand how frustrating a slow broadband connection can be and appreciate your patience while we work to resolve this for you.

Thank you for your response which, while being fulsome, I must admit to being unhappy with, as it offers absolutely no practical solution or time for change, whatever.

Would you, yourself be happy to receive this kind of 'non-response? I shall be copying the "information" you have currently provided to the editor of our regional newsletter so that it may achieve a wider circulation.

Perhaps you would consider offering them some more positive information as to the potential effects of the fibre recently laid past the entrance of our road? or even an estimate of when it and other changes will relieve the situation up here? We arent going to march into town and burn down the Telecom buildings if you arent completely accurate to the day! – but we dont like being given the "mushroom" treatment - (kept in the dark and being fed bullshit, if you didnt already know...)

Update on broadband in Waiatarua

One of our residents has been corresponding with Telecom about the speed of their broadband. Telecom has advised them that they are upgrading exchanges in our area to ADSL2+. These upgrades are taking place over the next six months and will benefit many residents. Unfortunately those of you living in the Mountain Rd area or on Scenic Drive north of Piha Rd may not see any benefit. If your internet provider is not Telecom you will also need to check with your provider.

Telecom now has a simple tool that will tell you what the service is likely to be in your area. Type the internet address, below, into your web browser and then type in your street address. This will then show information about the upgrades occurring in your area.

Weeds in Waiatarua

At a recent Council Meeting, Sandra Coney expressed at interest in talking to WRRA about the proliferation of environmental weeds on the roadsides around Waiatarua. Sandra is the Waitakere Ranges councillor on the Auckland Council.

Dave, John and Susanne from the WRRA Committee met with Sandra on Monday 23 May. She brought Jack Craw with her (Manager Biosecurity - Environmental Services for the Auckland Council).

The roads they are concerned with are West Coast Rd, Scenic Drive, Forest Hill Road and Piha Road where all the worst environmental weeds are growing in abundance. The good news is the roadsides are the responsibility of the Auckland Transport Authority and Sandra and Jack will be contacting them and ensuring they urgently address this problem.

It is hoped that if the ATA removes the roadside weeds, the residents may be inspired to remove their own environmental weeds and therefore increase the value of their properties.

During the meeting Sandra and Jack did suggest an information meeting at our hall for the purpose of making us aware of the weeds and plants that are the problems and also the best ways to treat them.

We are quite happy to facilitate this meeting if there is a desire from the public to have one. We do not intend to have people give up their spare time to talk to an empty hall.
