# **Alert: Changing Road Rules**

# Change I:The left-turn versus right-turn rule

From 5am on 25 March 2012, this new rule will require all traffic turning right to give way to a

vehicle coming from the opposite direction and turning left. This only applies at cross roads, T-intersections and driveways where:

- a) both vehicles are facing each other with no signs or signals (neither vehicle is controlled)
- b) both vehicles are facing give way signs
- c) both vehicles are facing stop signs
- d) both vehicles are facing green traffic signals

Change 2: At uncontrolled T-intersections ('uncontrolled' means when there are no signs or signals to tell you what to do)

At an uncontrolled T-intersection, all traffic from a **terminating road** (bottom of the T) will have to give way to all traffic on a **continuing road** (top of the T). This will bring it into line with T-intersections where there are Stop or Give Way signs on the terminating road.

This rule change will also apply to uncontrolled driveways, such as at a supermarket or hospital. From 5am on 25 March 2012 the traffic exiting the driveway will need to give way to all traffic on the road. All vehicles entering or exiting a driveway must continue to give way to pedestrians on a footpath, or cyclists and pedestrians on a cycle path or shared path. Drivers should not pull out to block the footpath in front of pedestrians and cyclists.

The Western Quilters Circle's annual show - **Quilts Across the Ranges** - is on again! Friday March 16 to Sunday 18 March between 10am and 4pm at Kelston Community Centre, cnr Gt North and Awaroa Roads, Glendene. Entry fee is \$5.00.

As well as a great exhibition of our members' quilts, wall hangings and other innovative and colourful creations, we are hosting the only Auckland showing of the New Zealand Quilter Magazine travelling Suitcase Exhibition. There are merchants selling quilting and craft related goods, and a members' trading table with lots of bargains available.

We have an on site cafe with yummy goodies baked by our talented members, and also have magazines and newspapers available for those who are "just along for the ride".

A new table tennis stadium is to be built at Parrs Park in time for the World Veterans Table Tennis Championships in 2014. The Waitemata Table Tennis Association stadium will accelerate growth in the fast developing Parrs Park area and link in with Henderson's Waitakere Trusts' Stadium, the main venue for the international competition.

Waitakere Ranges Local Board is supporting Table Tennis New Zealand's bid to host the biennial

championships, one of the world's largest table tennis events. And Titirangi's \$19 million Lopdell project is moving to the building consent phase following agreement from Auckland Council's strategy and finance committee and the Waitakere Ranges Local Board. It is expected the two-year, four-stage project will start early this year with the construction of a new carpark deck, followed by Lopdell House seismic strengthening and heritage restoration, a new gallery, and finally the upgrade of Lopdell Hall (the Treasure House).

Waitakere Ranges Local Board is managing the partnership with Lopdell House Development Trust on behalf of the council, and working with the trust to help deliver the Lopdell House restoration and new gallery. Waitakere Ranges Local Board Chair Denise Yates says the board is delighted to be working with the trust on the project.

**To Chop Or Not To Chop:** It has come to our attention that since the new laws came into place on Jan 1<sup>st</sup>, 2012 re the changes to tree protection rules, some of our residents and indeed some arborists working in our area, are a little confused as to what we can and cannot do.

If you do want to have your own little 'chainsaw massacre' please visit the appropriate website (see below) or maybe simply google the words-Auckland City Council tree consent- and see what comes up. Locals need to be aware that we are considered Rural under the definition provided on the website; hence we are not able to "enjoy" the same rules.

Weed Bin: The wet summer has caused the weeds to grow in abundance and the bin at the Fire Station is being emptied every I - 2 weeks. However there has been a problem recently with someone leaving very heavy bags of weeds beside the bin. The bin people will not remove anything outside the bin and unfortunately I am not strong enough to lift your bags into the bin.

I check the bin at least once a week and it only takes 2 days for a replacement to be delivered. If you have a large amount of weeds, please check first to see if the bin can accommodate them. Take something to stand on so it is easier to empty your weeds into the bin and then take the plastic bags home with you.

For the month of March the War on Weeds will once again be in operation and there will be an extra bin at the junction of Kauri Loop Road and West Coast Road. - Susanne Timms

"Death Benefit" by Robin Cook. A couple of investment bankers stumble on to a money making scheme. They buy life insurance policies from elderly people needing money for a token amount. Death can't be that far off – can it? However some medical researchers are succeeding at growing replacement organs from stem cells and who better to experiment on. One of the researcher dies mysteriously – read on.

"A Train In Winter" – Caroline Moorhead. A tough read but well worth it. This is the story of 230 French women who were involved in the Resistance. They were shipped to Auschwitz from all over France, but became a tight group supporting, caring for and encouraging each other. Only 49 survived and at the time of writing only 9 were still alive.

"Traces Of Red" – Paddy Richardson. A TV journalist's Saturday night show is about to be canned. Can she save it with her latest campaign? She believes a man convicted of murdering 3 members of his family may be innocent. The prosecution's case was full of holes, but the media portrayal of him may have coloured the jury and public's perception of him and judged him guilty.

"77 Shadow Street" – Dean Koontz. A building has a tragic past. The past occupants have a history of madness, murder, suicide and there are whispers of even worse. These incidents happen every 38 years. Altered to an apartment building in the 70's all has been peaceful, it's past forgotten. However things start to happen once more. There are phantom voices, strange shadows, even plunging lifts. Koontz at his best.

#### Fire Safety

Responsible use of fireworks

Please remember the last two years over summer the irresponsible use of fireworks caused major fires in our bush. The 5<sup>th</sup> of November is the approved day for fireworks.

#### Family BBQ Safety Tips

With daylight saving giving us more evening sun, many of us will be using the extra hours to fire up the barbecue and get family and friends together.

- Supervise children around grills. If using a public grill, close the barbecue fence if there is one.
- Keep matches and lighters away from children. Teach children to report any loose matches or lighters to an adult immediately.
- Before using a grill, check the connection between the gas tank and the fuel line. Test for leaks using soapy water. Do not overfill the gas tank.
- Dispose of hot coals properly douse them with plenty of water, and stir them to ensure that the fire is out. Never place them in plastic, paper or wooden containers they can take up to five days to cool.
- Never grill/barbecue in enclosed areas carbon monoxide could be produced and can be fatal.
- · Make sure your barbecue is completely extinguished when finished.
- Alcohol and fire don't mix Know your limits and drink responsibly.
