Track Closure To Halt Kauri Die-Back

Formation of protection zones around unaffected kauri in the dense forest west of Auckland City was called for last month by Auckland Council's parks, recreation and heritage forum. This will take place from I July and there will be a full communication programme with local communities preceding this and a stepped up media campaign with stronger messages.

Officials have reported a higher incidence of the kauri dieback disease in areas more often visited by walkers and survey work showed the need for more extensive measures to protect healthy kauri than the present boot disinfection stations.

Forum chairman Sandra Coney said it was a precautionary approach that still allowed enjoyment of most of the Waitakere Ranges Regional Park, which had 256km of tracks.

Protection zones were proposed for the Cascade Kauri, Anawhata, Waiatarua, Piha, Karekare, Huia and Parau areas, to be reviewed in a year while scientists learned more about the disease and whether a vaccine or cure could be found.

New Books at Waiatarua Library

"A Walk Across the Sun" – Addison Corban. This novel takes the reader into the world of the global trade in human beings. Centrepiece are two young homeless, orphaned, Indian girls who are forced to live their lives in a brothel. An American lawyer decides to spend his sabbatical doing pro-bono work in India and takes on the criminal world in his effort to raise awareness of, and secure the freedom of these and all the other girls.

"The Little Shadows" – Marina Endicott. Follow the lives of three sisters as they start performing in vaudeville at the start of the 20th Century. They have to earn a living to support their mother, as well as themselves after the death of their father and brother. As they mature and grow as artists their life in the bright lights of the stage is echoed in life off-stage.

"Extremely Loud and Incredibly Close" – Jonathan Foer. An unusual, young lad is mourning the loss of his father in the Twin Towers attack. He finds an envelope with a key amongst his father's things and written on this is the name "Black". He feels this is important and takes it upon himself to find "Black' somewhere in New York. He roams the city meeting many strange and varied people but the journey takes him back to his father's grave.

"The Snow Child" – Eowyn Ivey. Set in Alaska in the 1920s, this story is based on a fairy tale. A childless couple build a child from snow during the first snowfall of the season. The snow child disappears overnight but in its place a young blond haired girl appears in their life. Is she real or magical? Is she the answer to the couple's prayers?

"The Street Sweeper" – Elliott Perlman. What do we know about the people we pass by in the street? A tough doctor, a street sweeper, an academic and an holocaust survivor all get to know each other and all have a story to tell. This novel spans decades and tells of memory, race, the will to survive and encompasses all our frailties.

Enjoy whatever you are reading.
