The Waiatarua Fire Brigade will be holding the Guy Fawkes Bonfire as usual. So come along on Saturday November 3rd (or the rain day Sunday 4th) for a fun family night. If you have any doubt about the weather just phone the fire station on 814 9213 on the night. We will light the bonfire once it gets dark. Fireworks are welcome, but children must be supervised at all times

When: Saturday November 3rd from 6pm onwards

Fire Safety

If you are not planning to attend the Community Bonfire or public displays then please remember:

- Only one person should be in charge of fireworks. If that's you, then make sure you take all the necessary precautions.
- Read the instructions in daylight and don't drink any alcohol until they've all been discharged.
- Make your preparations in advance, and in daylight. On the night, you will need: a torch; a bucket or two of water; eye protection and gloves; a bucket of soft earth to put fireworks in; suitable supports and launchers if you're setting off Catherine wheels or rockets.
- Protect your animals. You should take precautions to protect your pets during, before and after Guy Fawkes. Make sure they are safely inside and safe when fireworks are being let off.

Weed Bin

Can we please ask people to take care when coming to the station to make use of the weed bin. It has been very muddy around the bin over winter and the ground is not hard enough for cars to drive on. Please be aware that if you are at the station unloading weeds that the fire station can be operational at any time. Please make sure that your vehicle/trailer does not block access to the station or inhibit the fire trucks leaving the station, and do not park in the car parks as they are reserved for the fire fighters responding to emergency call outs. Thank you.

Our new book shelves are full! Here's a few to choose from.

"Ancient Light" – John Banville. An ageing actor is still coming to terms with the recent suicide of his daughter. As he ponders events his mind strays to his own youth and the affair he had with the mother of his friend. What are memories?

"When In Rome" – Nicky Pellegrino. Set in Rome in the 1950s, this novel tells of young sisters out busking for money. One dreams of the handsome singer Mario Lanza and uses her money to go to all his movies. He comes to Rome. What to do? The life she knows or the one she dreams of.

"Osama" – Chris Ryan. Osama is dead and Joe knows this is so because he was there and saw the Seals' operation and them carry out the body. Now though, he's being targeted and someone is trying to destroy him. What really happened at the compound on that day and how does he find the truth?

"Toby's Room"- Pat Barker. Toby goes off to fight in WWI and is posted as "missing believed dead". His sister finds this hard to accept and tries to find out what happened. She contacts one of Toby's friends and comes to understand the wider impact of war — on the wounded, the families left behind and those working to help those badly wounded.

"The Cleansing of Mohamed" – Chris de Court. Mohamed was one of two cameleers who fired upon a picnic train at Broken Hill in 1915. Police killed the two men but in their effects were found papers showing these New Australians were angry at the part the Australian forces played in the attack on their home country of Turkey. Their difficulties in becoming part of their chosen country give an insight into the seeds of terrorism.


