A SMALL SELECTION OF NON-FICTION NEW TO THE LIBRARY.

"A Fabled Land" - Bruce Ansley provides the text and Peter Bush the photos. A brilliant combination to tell the story of Mesopotamia, a high country sheep station. Bush has been visiting this station for many years and his anecdotes add a personal touch to his photos. Reading this book gives a great insight to the hardships our early high country settlers faced.

"Shackleton's Whisky" - This is more than just the story of the 3 cases of whisky found embedded in the ice at the Cape Royds hut in 2007. Neville Peat has combined the story of the making of the whisky with Shackleton's 1907 excursion to the Antarctic. Not much of a drinker himself, Ernest nevertheless travelled with 25 cases of whisky (amongst other supplies!). At the time of writing this I am halfway through the book and totally enjoying it.

"Brazil" - This book is the written accompaniment to the BBC series by Michael Palin. He criss-crosses this huge country travelling by boat, train and car and tells of the burgeoning economy and the amazing mixes of races, cultures and religions.

"The Old Ways" - Robert McFarlane embarked on a journey that would take to many places in the world as he explored the old paths, tracks and seaways. He tells about the natural history, geology, archaeology and literature of the paths he follows, and shares the stories of fellow trekkers he meets on their own personal journeys,

"Valerie" - Valerie Adams needs no introduction to us but her story, penned by Phil Gifford, is well worth reading. This young woman has an inspiring story to tell. She has faced so much in her short life and shown an amazing strength of character to rightly take her place as a world athlete.

Happy new year to all. Committee member Norma moved to Thames before Xmas and is loving it.

Now I am going to share with you some of the events in my life since we last spoke and I must make it clear I am not looking to make you feel sorry for me or looking for sympathy, I am doing a good job of that all by myself.

Late November I took part in the Bowel Cancer screening program that came through the mail, I nearly didn't as you can set your clock to how regular I am and everything is perfectly normal and normally perfect.

The test is very simple to do from home and in due course I was contacted to have a colonoscopy on I4th December and a biopsy was taken for pathologist report, I have to say that the word colonoscopy is far more daunting than the procedure.

On December 19th, last day at work for year, fall off a ladder and break upper left arm in 3 places and dislodge shoulder ball joint.

December 20th just leaving for appointment with orthopaedic surgeon when get a phone call to say biopsy positive I have bowel cancer.

I spent 2 days in hospital while they decided not to operate on my arm and at the time of writing this (14/01/2013) I am starting the fourth of six weeks of having left arm immobilised waiting to get a date for what is major surgery sometime February.

As you can imagine our usual Xmas camping trip went down the gurgler but Shirley got heaps done in her beloved garden and I sat in a chair doing countless crosswords. Only having one wing curtails lost of activities believe me.

There are two points I want to make here the first being ACC: They have been absolutely amazing to the point that they made contact with me on day one and everything was done over the phone with my first Loss Of Income payment within 10 days, and that was over Xmas/new year weeks.

Now the main point, if you have had a letter about this process and turned it down, contact Waitemata Health and do one, same applies if you get the letter in the mail DO IT.

My doctor told me that the government finally agreed to a trial of bowel screening and they chose Waitemata Health board only to do it, and they have started with those living in even numbers

Up until now I have had I broken bone, broke my nose at primary school, 2 operations, I tonsillectomy at 4 yrs before leaving England and a repeat at 15yrs.

So am I scared about the forthcoming operation, which the surgeon described as bigger than open heart, you better believe I'm scared.

Am I glad I did the test, YOU'D BETTER BELIEVE THAT as I intend to annoy all of you for many more years.

Which brings me nicely to the AGM in March, so please give serious consideration of becoming part of this great group of people who most have been together for a number of years. As we never know what is around the corner, and losing a member or two each AGM, new blood is important. On the same theme 2013 membership is now due.

I am taking a couple of months leave of absence, apart from doing Hotmail, so please for gods, peters, goodness, yours, your families or all of the preceding, do the test as

Fire Safety

BBQ safety

- Before using a grill, check the connection between the gas tank and the fuel line.
- Do not overfill the gas tank.
- Do not wear loose clothing while cooking at a barbecue.
- · Be careful when using lighter fluid.
- Do not add fluid to an already lit fire because the flame can flashback up into the container and explode.
- Keep all matches and lighters away from children. Teach your children to report any loose matches or lighters to an adult immediately.
- Supervise children around outdoor grills.
- Dispose of hot coals properly douse them with plenty of water, and stir them to ensure that the fire is out. Never place them in plastic, paper or wooden containers.
- Never grill/barbecue in enclosed areas carbon monoxide could be produced.
- Don't light fires in a fire ban area you could be liable for whatever damage is caused.

And finally, make sure your barbecue is completely extinguished when finished.
