Hi all,

I am writing this on Tues 9th April having just returned from my 6 weeks post op check up and I am now allowed to drive again, having been cleared a week ago by the Physiotherapist, I last drove on the 19th December so it is like getting let out of jail.

Still about a month away from being normal as my wound still has to heal and the arm still needs more work, still at least I don't need chemo or radiation treatment.

My surgeon told me that there have been 40 new cases of colon cancer since Xmas in Waitemata Health board alone, not all from the screening program but I would bet the program has inspired people to be screened anyway.

Shirley was diagnosed with breast cancer 2.5 years ago, during a routine mammogram and at this point we are both cancer free so it can be beaten at least in the meantime if not forever. As our doctor said when Shirley was diagnosed, "There is nothing like the word cancer to make you realise your mortality"

You would be surprised how many people you know that have had and have beaten it, most people are not like me and don't talk about it whereas I think they should.

During the past 3 months I have had reinforced for me what a fantastic group of people I get to work with on WRRA, they have just carried on in my absence, no fuss, no bother during what is a busy time with AGM and Debate planning as well as quiz night planning.

On top of that I give personal thanks to Frank, John and Andrea for being there when needed, but a huge thanks to Susanne who amongst cries of "I never want to be President", or "I don't know what I'm doing" has done a fantastic job and that statement is endorsed by the committee. On top of that she has provided me with transport at least once a week for most of the last 3 months. Thanks Susanne.

I am partly up to speed on what is happening and we are keeping an eye on the draft Auckland Unitary Plan will change quite a bit in the greater Auckland area especially in relation to building codes. I will be conveying information as to meetings as I get it via hotmail so if you are a financial member, you will get this.

Well that is about my lot for now, catch up at the debate and thanks for the positive emails I have received,

Fire Safety

With winter on the way the days are distinctly truncated and the welcoming smell of fires drifts through the hills, valleys and dells of Waiatarua. I know we've said it before and we will definitely be saying it again (repeatedly), but please ensure that you have your chimneys swept before using your fire.

There is nothing like sitting in front of the fireplace on a cold winter's night, but here is a list of things to be mindful of -

- · Clean chimneys and flues before your first fire
- · Always use a fire guard or spark guard with open fires
- Never throw thing like batteries or aerosol cans into your fireplace
- · Ashes can take up to five days to cool. Always empty into a metal bin and pour water over them.
