New Books At Waiatarua Library

On The Trail Of Genghis Khan. Imagine a novice horseman deciding to travel 10,000kms in the footsteps of Genghis Khan. Tim Cope did just this 700 years after the great warrior. He spent months travelling across the Steppes and Mongolia, through Khazakhstan, Russia, Crimea and the Ukraine to the Danube River in Hungary. On the way he witnessed humans surviving in tough environments, maintaining traditional ways and great hospitality. This is a great story.

Wake. In London in 1920, people are awaiting the arrival of the Unknown Soldier from France to his final resting place. In this highly rated novel Anna Hope intertwines this event with the lives of 3 women for whom the war is still having an impact as they deal with loss in their own way. Until a young man arrives at the door of one of them they do not know each other, then they connect and life changes as life is also changing for everyone in the new era.

The Invention Of Wings. "My body might be a slave but not my mind. For you it is the other way round". These words were uttered by the slave Handful to her owner Sarah who believed in emancipation and women's rights. Handful was the recipient of her mothers' storytelling and crafts keeping alive her family history. Based on the true story of Sarah Grimke, Sue Monk Kidd has written a moving story of the distance and closeness imposed by society on their relationship. Both sought freedom – one a physical freedom from the horror of slavery, and the other a chance to improve the lives of others by a change in attitudes.

Fire Safety- What to do in a fire

- Crawl low and fast to escape smoke. 'Get Down, Get Low, Get out.'
- Shut doors behind you to slow the spread of fire
- Meet at the planned meeting place.
- •Once out, stay out never go back inside.
- •Phone the Fire Service from a safe phone.

Tell the Fire Service •house number•street•nearest intersection•suburb and city•rural ID number if you have one

What to do after a fire....Do not enter your damaged house unless you have to and have been advised it is safe to do so. The Fire Service will check the water, electricity and gas supplies and either arrange to have them disconnected or advise you what action to take.

WAR ON WEEDS

It's that time of year again and Waiatarua residents have the entire month of March to dispose of invasive weeds at weed bins that Keep Waitakere Beautiful Trust (KWB) provides as part of its annual War on Weeds campaign.

The closest local bins will be at Kauri Loop Road and the Waiatarua Fire Station.

Last year 131 tonnes of weeds were collected and composted at Patiki Transfer Station. In past years there have been some people who have abused the programme. This year, bin monitors will be taking note of car registration numbers for those who dump inorganics, large tree branches or bamboo into the bins. These materials can't be composted down.

Please don't abuse the weed bins, they are a valuable resource and we can't afford to lose them. This especially applies to our long term bin at the local Fire Station which has been very messy lately. The following can't go into the bins:

- General garden waste. E.g. lawn clippings
- Household rubbish
- Native plants
- Palm trees
- Bamboo
- Big branches or tree trunks
