Backing BARK In Our Community

One year ago local Wajatarua resident Heather Summers set out to create a charitable organisation that would support the community in teaching children the basic fundamentals of safe interactions with dogs, with a view to reducing dog bite statistics in New Zealand.

A year later, Bark NZ has more than 30 volunteers covering the North Island, and offers a range of free educational programmes to schools and learning facilities.



These programmes include a reading programme aptly named Tales with Tails, an interactive exercise programme called Tag the Tails, and for children experiencing difficult times there is a Time with Tails programme which is extremely uplifting and therapeutic.

All programmes allow children who otherwise might not have the opportunity, to safely interact with a specially trained dog. As well as school visits, Bark NZ actively exhibits at community events, and has plans in the pipeline for a community event that will not only focus on dog safety, but also promote responsible dog walking in the Waitakere Ranges.

Bark NZ is 100% self funded, and all contributors provide their time for free.

Mick is still alive and will be aged 95 years next week. Apparently he has a memory like an elephant and could provide a breakdown of history and characters in and around Waiatarua over the period he was in the area.

You may have noticed if you have driven past the fire station a change of colour scheme; the building has recently been completely repainted, as part of the Fire Service planned maintenance programme.

This has given the building a completely new look, and also the carpets & flooring have been replaced as well, a big thanks to the Property

management team!

The storm that ripped through Auckland on Wednesday the 6th June saw the Fire Service attend 600 callout in a few hours. Both of Waiatarua's Fire Appliances were sent to assist not only in Waiatarua but as far away as Pt Chevalier, attending 11 incidents in less than 4 hours.

The Brigade also attended a potentially serious incident after ashes from a fire place were carelessly disposed of in a plastic bucket and placed against the side of a building resulting in the building catching fire. It was quickly spotted by a neighbour and fully extinguished by the brigade by removing the internal and external wall linings. Please remember to always dispose of ashes into a metal container and place away from buildings as they can take up to a week to cool properly!

Fire Safety

Fireplaces & chimneys

- Clean chimneys and flues before your first fire of the season.
- Always use a fireguard or spark-guard with open fires.
- Never throw rubbish into the fireplace particularly batteries and aerosol cans.
- Ashes can take up to five days to cool always empty fireplace or wood burner ashes and ashtrays into a metal bin and pour water over them before disposal.
- Before going to sleep, make sure your fireplace fire is out


