### **Keeping Our Streets Safe**


You may have seen the new CPNZ – Waiatarua Community Patrol vehicle driving around.

Well it is now one full year in August since we started. During that time we have built up a very good working relationship with the Police and the Fire Service which has seen us being approached by these organisations for assistance at various incidents. During this time we have done 199 patrols, we have travelled 11,101 kms, we have spent 876 hours patrolling and we have reported 202 incidents to Police, Council and others.

We currently cover the Waiatarua, Oratia and Henderson Valley area with 22 volunteers and have seen a big reduction in problems within the areas due to being visibly seen. We do however need more Patrollers.

We need to get the roster to 40 so people who can spend a couple of hours per month patrolling.

I have heard many complaints about how hard it is to talk to Auckland Transport. But that may be about to change. This week in my email from Auckland Transport:

"Auckland Transport (AT) has a new Engagement Plan, developed with the input of local boards in the region, which specifies the issues on which it will engage with residents' and business organisations. To pull together an initial list of these organisations, we have obtained information from a number of sources, including previous consultations undertaken by the organisation, and information supplied by local board offices about organisations in their area."

So if you have any transport issues that affect Waiatarua please let me know. Our Secretary, Gary Ertel, has met with Civil Defence this month and discovered that Waiatarua is considered to be at very low risk of being isolated by any type of Civil Emergency. Really? What do you think? More on this soon.

# FROM BLAKE RADFORD AT THE JUNIOR WORLD SOFTBALL SERIES, WHITEHORSE IN THE YUKON TERRITORY, CANADA.

Firstly, I would like to say a huge THANK YOU to all the Waiataruians that came out to support Connor and myself on our quest for GOLD at the Junior World Softball Champs in Whitehorse. The money raised on the Trivial Pursuit night was truly amazing and contributed to a large portion of the money needed to get us there.

I am one of the pitchers for the Premier Roosters Softball Club team in North Harbour and was selected to represent New Zealand at the Under 19 Worlds along with my team mate Connor Peden, who is one of the catchers for the team. Our team started their campaign with some warm up games in Vancouver the week before heading up to Whitehorse to the tournament which ran from 11th July to the 20th July. Our team had a tough start to the campaign with our first games being against Australia and USA before facing Denmark, Canada, Japan, Argentina, Czech Republic, Singapore and Mexico. Argentina were the reigning world champions and they were the only team that we lost to in the round robin with Argentina winning all 9 of their games in the round robin.

We progressed through to the semi finals to face Argentina again where we managed a 3-1 win to put us into the final and that meant that Argentina were to play Japan to find the other team to progress into the final, this turned out to be probably the best game of the tournament with Argentina winning 2-1 in extra innings.

The final was a disappointing game as we struggled to match Argentina. We came away with a silver medal, this was a great accomplishment for us as this was the first time A New Zealand junior team had won a medal since 1993 at the Junior World Championships.

### Fire Safety:

If you are not planning to attend the community bonfire or public displays then please remember: only one person should be in charge of fireworks. If that's you, then make sure you take all the necessary precautions. Read the instructions in daylight and don't drink any alcohol until they've all been discharged. Make your preparations in advance and in daylight. On the night, you will need...

- A torch.
- A bucket or two of water.
- Eye protection and gloves.
- · A bucket of soft earth to put fireworks in.
- · Suitable supports and launchers if you're setting off Catherine wheels or
- Protect your animals. You should take precautions to protect your pets during, before and after Guy Fawkes, make sure they are safely inside and safe when fireworks are being let off.
