

NEW BOOKS AT WAIATARUA LIBRARY

"WATERLOO"- Bernard Cornwell. Riveting and tense. As the bicentenary of Waterloo looms, Cornwell has penned his first non-fiction book about this landmark battle. Widely acclaimed and easily read, he recounts the heroism, tragedies and misery amongst the armies of Britain, France and Prussia. It was the first time the two great commanders had faced each other and until the evening of June 18th it looked like the French were winning. Read it!

"THE SACRIFICE" – Joyce Carol Oates. This novel is based on an incident that happened 30 years ago in New York. A young woman is missing. When found she claims to have been abducted and raped by a group of men including a police officer. Oates delves deep into issues of multi-layered racism, class and violence and its impact on daily lives and perceptions of the actions of those involved . As the story develops conflicting "evidence" from everyone – the victim, her mother, the rescuer and the police – adds up to a belief of what is right or wrong has been coloured by life's experiences.

"THE NIGHTINGALE" – Kristin Hannah. Another good one from this author. In 1995 an elderly woman is about to enter an assisted living facility. As her life is being packed up she starts to recall the life of herself and her sister in German occupied France during WW2. They each responded in different ways to the challenges but both showed incredible strength and were involved in acts of bravery. Pain and fear were common in their lives and at times they each had to make unpalatable choices.

"FIRST IMPRESSIONS" – Charlie Lovett. From the author of "The Bookman's Tale". A young woman who is a book lover and Jane Austen fan is puzzled when 2 quite different customers come into her antiquarian bookshop in search of the same, 2nd edition copy of an obscure work by Rev Richard Hadfield. Reading this leads to questions about the authorship of Pride and Prejudice and a mystery which endangers the woman's life. Alongside this developing story the author explores the relationship between Austen and the Rev Hadfield. Who wrote that book??

Kia ora Waiatarua!

We've just had the AGM of the WRRA and I would like to farewell some and welcome other members of the Committee. Susanne Timms has resigned as Vice President after about 8-9 years on the Committee. Susanne will continue to monitor and facilitate the weed bin for us. Gary Ertel was elected to Vice-President from Secretary. John Stagg has moved to Oratia. Continuing on the Committee are Sue Bowers as Treasurer and Robyn O'Sullivan, Mark Large, Brett Whyte and John Andersen.

At the AGM in my annual President's report I told the story of how I came to this place. Five years ago we were living in Kingsland in a relocated villa right beside the motorway. Being our first house we made the concession of being only 10m from the edge of the north-western motorway. We used to pretend the traffic noise was the ocean, or the wind in the trees.

But we knew we wouldn't be there forever and Lhara dutifully scoured the 'For Sale' pages on a regular basis. One day 909 West Coast Road popped up in a small ad and without telling me she inspected it. A complete do up she said. But so far from the City, I said. But under the radar, she said. But it needs so much work, I said. So much opportunity, she said. The space, setting and view convinced me.

We lived in Waiatarua for a couple of years before we fled back to the city to overcome a school zone rule change. Two years later though we were back at 909 beside the Community Centre. We'd also decided we were here to stay. It was time to get to know Waiatarua better.

What better way, when Dave Pocock announced his resignation, than to run for President of the Residents and Ratepayers. So I spent 2014 learning what Waiatarua is all about, who lives here, and what they care about.

Waiatarua is a special place, being part of the Waitakere Ranges Heritage Area, a buffer zone between the national park and the city. We like the quiet and the native flora and fauna, which is threatened by aggressive weeds like wild ginger. Transport is essential; we care about our roads; we want AT to listen to us. But we often feel ignored by Auckland City Council with rates increasing, our bus service threatened.

Next month I'll talk about what we'll be doing at the WRRA this year. I'd be interested to know, does the suburb of the billing address on your rates say Waiatarua?


