A Selection Of Our New Highly Recommended Reads at Waiatarua Library.

"The Secret Life Of Luke Livingstone" – Charity Norman. They meet, they fall in love and marry. Thirty years later Luke feels compelled to tell his wife the secret he has always lived with. He struggles with his identity as a man and knows he is a woman in the body of a man. He has chosen to change rather than end his life. The daily depth of emotions – heartache, despair, humiliation – leave the family in disarray. Luke is still the person they love and will continue to love, but acceptance is difficult. This is thoughtfully written with much empathy and perception of the plight those in this situation endure.

"The Water Diviner" – Andrew Anastasios. A grieving father from Australia travels to Gallipoli in an effort to retrieve the bodies of his 3 sons. He promised his wife that he would bury them in consecrated ground. There is no body for his eldest son and he discovers he may still be alive. Plus, does a burial in ground consecrated with the crescent of the land rather that the cross of his belief make any difference in the end? This story focusses not on war, but on recovery and rebuilding post war.

"Let Me Be Frank With You" – Richard North. Frank Bascomb (The Sportswriter) is now 68, and looking forward to a simpler life in retirement. Hurricane Sandy has devastated much of the Northeast and in this series of 4 novellas we meet a wry, grumpy Frank getting involved in the lives of unrelated people but all suffering as a result of the hurricane. His attempts to console and reconcile are wonderfully recounted by this great author.

"A Spool Of Blue Thread" – Anne Tyler. The Whitshank parents are not only getting older but they are now suffering from ill-health, alarming their 4 grown children. Abby has "mind gaps" and Red has had a heart attack. Two generations have lived in family home and it has a precious place in all their hearts. Tyler is a great observer of dramas, joys, disagreements and love in families and it is all here. Old hurts and secrets, along with good times come to the fore in this novel about the make-up of an adult family and changing responsibilities.




