Eventually these letters get posted off about a week before Christmas but usually make it there before the big day. Weeks before, I'd have posted off the birthday card for my father so it got there for the 29th December. For some strange reason both cards usually arrived at the same time.

This year will be different, in June we were over in the UK and met most of the family. The reason? My fathers funeral.

So this year's a bit different. It's been, as the Queen would say, an Annus Horribilis. When Dad found it hard to recover from a bad cold last Christmas he had various tests which established that he was anaemic so a blood transfusion and some iron tablets seemed to fix the issue. But a month or so later we were back to square one. To cut a long story short after various tests Dad was diagnosed with Cancer of the small intestine on the 8th May, we started to talk about a visit to the UK, but by the 21st it became urgent and despite Internal Affairs turning the boys passports round in 8 hours we couldn't make it back before he died.

We spent 3 happy and sad weeks in the UK with the boys finally meeting their Big brother, but nothing would take away that fact that Dad wasn't there.

Then to really make this year rotten we have several friends who have also lost mothers, and fathers.

So this Christmas is going to be different, I will get around to writing that letter, and sending the christmas cards to the UK, but we will be remembering Dad as last Christmas no one suspected it would be his last.

So I ask you all, as you all prepare for the festive season to remember the people who have passed, celebrate with those around you and have the best Christmas you've ever had.

Caveat Emptor.

I now fully understand the definition.

Recently my water pump stopped working. So I called a local plumber recommended by a local plumbing supplier. Rang the plumber and said my water pump was not working. "Ok", he said "I'll be there this afternoon".

In the mean time I thought I'd clean the filter and in the process broke the plastic fitting. Not despairing as I knew the plumber was coming that afternoon. He arrived, assessed the situation and said "mate this is all wrong". (Note it had been going well for three years)

I was ready for this as every time a plumber comes up they say it is wrong. They then set it up as they think it should be.

But to cut a long story short, he got the water pipe repaired and re-aligned pipes and filters and then we tried the water and the pump did not work. "Oh I'm not a pump technology expert, you need an electrician". My local electrician I use said straight out 'I don't do pumps.'

To be fair, I then rang the original plumber and he arranged for a pump technician to come. The pump technician took around 20 minutes, found the problem, fixed it and was gone. I expected to pay around \$500 for the plumber – his account \$900 and I still have to pay for the second visit.

Therefore, if you think you have a pump problem, don't call a plumber or if you do, ask if they know about pumps and how to fix them. What really grates is that all the time the plumber was here on site, he was talking about pump systems he had been installing over the last twenty or so years. Caveat Emptor -Gary Ertel.


