The Passing of a Waiataruan Icon and Creative Genius

On 26th October Stuart Slater passed away at North Shore Hospital surrounded by family: he passed away to Valhalla where the Blacksmith's forge blows.

49 years ago Stuart and Peppy Slater bought a small cottage towards the top of Forest Hill Road, which they added on to for their 3 daughters, Tui, Shelley and Nina. Maybe

you saw his castle letterbox which was there for some years before it was damaged.


Stuart was very active in Neighbourhood Support especialy when he reitred from full time outside work. Not only did he keep an eye out for burglars but he actually interrupted at least 2 lots of burglars. He jumped in his van with a 4 by 2 and chased them down the road.

Drama: The whole family was totally involved in the local drama group particularly from about 1980-1988 - performing, prop building, step building, cooking sumptious meals, raffling, costuming and more. For the school plays that Peppy wrote and directed, Stuart made top hats and replica guns and special shoes for all the children performing.

Stuart was a complete artisan with a quirky sense of humour. He had a stand at the Ellerslie Flower Shows featuring his amazing, exciting and extraordinary copper statues, with a story about each one. He won 2 gold awards 4 times. He forged a copper statue of a violinist who he had seen busking in Shortland Street who was adamant that he was blind. The statue had one foot firmly planted on a penny.

There is not enough space here to cover his extensive talents and artistry.





He taught and inspired many and especially his daughters who have carried on his artistic ability.

What a colourful character he was. Always good for a yarn and always ready to use his talents for the Community.
