Enjoy the month.



From The Library: Jeanette Ziesler

Recent Additions On The Library Shelves.

"Laucala Bay" – Bee Dawson. Laucala Bay is in Fiji and NZ was given the responsibility of air reconnaissance in that part of the Pacific at the start of WW2. A RNZAF base was established and maintained there until 1967. Initially the base was to provide facilities for flying boats. Many of our servicemen served there over that long period, often moving there with their families. Dawson has written a very interesting social history of the base, with the inclusion of many photos.

"No Man's Land" – Simon Tolkien. The author is the grandson of the great J.R.R Tolkien and has written this novel based on the experiences of his grandfather. A young lad grew up in a poor environment until a twist of fate enabled him to live in a stately and eventually go to Oxford University. He went to France during WW1 and fought in the battle of the Somme. His experiences in the trenches form a part of the story and then the coping afterwards when it became apparent that not all war wounds are visible. Good read.

"The Restorer" – Michael Sala. This story is set in Newcastle, Australia. A mother takes her 2 children and reunites with her estranged husband in an effort to save her marriage. They move into a derelict house which the father is restoring. All is not well however, and the original reason for the separation still haunts their lives. Slowly the suspense builds up, the family becomes more dysfunctional and a climax is reached.

"The Mothers" – Brit Bennett. Set in an African American community, the Mothers are a group of older women in a church community who observe, judge, opine but are also kind and do share their combined wisdom. Some things do escape their oversight though. The lives of 3 young members of the church become intertwined, with one young woman having a relationship with the Pastor's son and later becoming a friend of the other woman. The secrets and consequences of this will haunt them forever.

Fire Brigade News

Many of Waiatarua's volunteer firefighters didn't get a lot of sleep in the first week of May. On the evening of the 1st and wee small hours of the 3rd, crews from Piha, Karekare and Waiatarua were kept busy extinguishing multiple small scrub fires lit in the Piha area.

Then early Sunday morning it was all hands to the pump. A second-alarm shop fire and two large scrub fires all occurred simultaneously in South Piha, eventually drawing firefighters from as far away as Silverdale and Hunua. Unfortunately the shop was already well ablaze when the first crews reached it, but quick work and a calm night meant that the scrub fires were contained before they claimed any houses.

At the time of writing, Police had just confirmed that they had made an arrest and laid charges of arson, so Piha residents and all of West Auckland's firefighters hope that this is over.

Winter Fire Safety

Whatever you use for heating, always remember the heater-metre rule. Keep furniture, curtains, clothes and children at least one metre away. Don't store anything on top of them, and don't cover them.
