"Resolution" - A N Wilson. At 17 years of age, George Forster sailed on the Resolution with Captain Cook. He kept a diary of the journey as the lands, cultures, flora and fauna of the Pacific were observed and recorded. Once the ship returned to its port Forster published his account of the voyage – prior to Cook's own publication. Wilson has based his novel on Forster's writings and the further adventures of Forster with his involvement and ultimate death in the French Revolution

"Beren And Luthien" – J.R.R. Tolkien. The famous authors son has edited his father's early diaries and published this book. Beren – a mortal- falls in love with Lucien, who is an immortal elf. Her father imposes a seemingly impossible task for Beren to complete before the marriage can take place. A new and stand alone story from Tolkien.

"Red Sky At Noon"- Simon Sebag Montefiore. Benya Golden is imprisoned in a gulag for a crime he did not commit. His way out is to join a penal battalion consisting of prisoners and Cossacks. They get sent on a mission behind enemy lines in Southern Russia with the idea that these suicidal attacks will earn them redemption. They are not allowed to retreat so continue the fight, attacking Russian traitors who are fighting lan Ford. with the Germans. As well as the fighting Benya gets involved in several love affairs.

> "Freedom At Midnight - Viceroy's House" - L . Collins & D. Lapierre. After 300 years of British rule the Union Jack was lowered on the flagstaff at the Viceroy's house announcing the end of the British Raj. The country was separated into India and Pakistan on a religious divide, with adjacent Kashmir determined to be independent. This freedom has come at a high price with ongoing disputes. This book is an updated and very readable edition.
