Hello Waiatarua!

It was with regret that this week I accepted Rita Steel's resignation as holder of the Environmental portfolio of the WRRA Executive Committee. Rita has been a fantastic contributor to the monitoring of these issues in our little bit of paradise and the establishment of what is to become in 2018 a fully fledged Pest Free Waiatarua initiative.

Not to shy away from a challenge Rita has decided to join the Tree Council to try and achieve some real progress on what we are all coming to realise are vital issues for us and our environment, but which under the Unitary Plan now allows wholesale destruction of Kauri and other natives in parts of Waiatarua. What next?

Rita told me "I signed up to sit on the R&R with the sole purpose of doing everything I can to ensure the Waitakere Heritage Area within which we live is protected. My recent discovery that the Unitary plan has wiped out protection for what appears to be around 5% of the area and about 10% of the Waiatarua area has ..." appalled her and shocked me. These are decisions that were made by drawing lines on a map, not by visiting the area and understanding its significance.

This was in spite of Rita scrutinising the Unitary Plan in great detail during the public consultations and pursuing Council planners who denied this was taking place.

On behalf of WRRA Members, I wish you well, Rita, in your endeavours and ask you keep in touch with us about anything we can do to help.

A good time to remind you that we have vacancies on our committee right now, especially if you'd like to help with threats to the natural environment. Don't wait for it to become a crisis. Get in touch with us now.

Christmas Kumaras

Serves 6

I 1/4 kg kumaras

I cup drained pineapple pieces

½ tsp ground cloves

2 tbs brown sugar

30g softened butter

2 tbs pineapple juice

Preheat oven to 160C regular bake. Grease a shallow baking dish.

Peel kumara and slice into 2cm rings. Place in a pan of lightly salted water and cook until just tender. Drain well.

Arrange in the dish, alternating layers of kumara with pineapple, finishing with a layer of kumara.

In a small bowl, mix together cloves, sugar and butter to form a paste, adding pineapple juice to get to a thin spreading consistency. Spread over the top of the kumara.

Bake in the oven for half an hour. After half an hour, raise the temperature to 190 degrees C to brown the top layer.

Serve as a side dish for your Christmas table.


