Piha Road Intersection—The Saga Continues

Subsequent to the advice Wayne Edwards received from Auckland AT have advised that they have few records of the many "events" Transport regarding plans to improve safety at the Waiatarua inter- that happen at this intersection and for this reason attention to the section of Scenic Drive, Piha Rd and Ouinns Rd, as published in the intersection has not been a priority. Because of this, Anna has un-March newsletter, he has been advised that the information he was given was not "official".

Wayne now understands the information he received came from "the roading team" and it was not the "official" position. Despite assurances that directional arrows and advisory signage for long wheelbase vehicles would be in place within weeks, this apparently is now problematic. It could be that communication between the entities within AT may be the problem. It may be a case of wait and see, but the application of directional arrows and signage should only be a minor expense when road safety is involved.

A concept for a roundabout has been requested but as this is a "major project", feedback on this may not be available until May.

In the meantime, Wayne has been contacted by Anna Shattky, a Insurance claim Piha resident. A few weeks ago she was hit head on as she came around the Scenic Drive curve in front of Elevation by a tourist driver who came off the Piha Rd compulsory stop and entered the Scenic Drive on to the wrong side. Luckily there were no injuries, but because no one was injured, this accident, like many others, was not reported.


