### No Public Transport for Waiatarua

In the last year our community has gone backwards rather than forwards in terms of public transport. To zero in fact. This loss of essential service is more frustrating when we have a "carbon zero" focused Council and an aging community with no footpath access that the service is not attractive enough compared to driving. here.

WRRA have recently corresponding with the Local Board and Council regarding the removal of the 156 bus service and its school bus replacement. We are determined to restore public transport to Waiatarua.

### **Status Ouo**

The 156 route, had which operated three trips a day on weekdays and on which many were dependent, had apparently experienced 10 or fewer passengers per trip.

Following 2014 consultation for a 'New Network' of bus services across Auckland, AT removed the 156 bus service and replace it with an amended school service to cater for the student demand in June 2017.

A new dedicated school bus, route number 056, is now operating Some pressure and political inclination may result in the restoration on school days. This bus has a morning trip from Forest Hill Road and West Coast Road to Avondale College.

The 156 in the afternoon which starts at Avondale College and travels directly to Glen Eden, but does not make it to Waiatarua at

We await a response from Avondale college to confirm whether other students can catch either service.

### **Future possible developments**

Due to the current implementation of the bus New Network for Auckland's urban areas, AT will start to look at additional services for the outer areas of Auckland, including the Waitakere Ranges, after the New Network's completion this year.

In March/April 2016, AT held a survey for residents of the Ranges and beaches.

Two possible scheduled services were identified which could be viable and "warrant further investigation":

- Potential route I Piha to Glen Eden, via Waiatarua and Oratia. This is supported by WRRA.
- Potential route 2 Huia / Parau to New Lynn.

While two potential new services have been identified, budget is unavailable in this financial year, as AT has been focused on delivering the New Network across Auckland for 2018. They see risk that patronage could not be as high as people expressed in the survey, and that the long journey time from Piha to the City could mean

These services may have to be fully funded by Auckland Council. However, AT will also be seeking direction from NZTA in the next few months on options to access potential additional Central Government funding for public transport and will recommend that this in part be channelled into additional services, which if agreed may permit earlier implementation in 2019 of a solution.

Waiatarua must make its wishes known to Council and if possible find ways to help or motivate AT to apply pressure to NZTA to fund the additional service or trial.

Councillor Penny Hulse stated that she is in support of a response to this ongoing issue stating "We are aware that funding has been constrained and that the focus has been on higher use areas, but I agree that a longer term plan to have some choices for people to use public transport in our Ranges is needed."


The holiday passed by all too quickly and before we knew it we were heading home to NZ and back to reality—with a bump, as it turned out.

There's a rise in house fires at this time of year, but you can do something about it by good housekeeping and practices.

Putting fireplace ashes in a metal container away from the house until they cool down, which can take days. Not in a rubbish bag next to the house!

Ensuring your fireplace has a screen with a proper fireguard, and the chimney has been checked and/or swept in the last year.

Not overloading power points or multi-boards with appliances that use a lot of power, like heaters.

Cleaning the lint from clothes dryers after every use.
