Waitakere Forest & Bird

Putting our ideas to the test - using birds to examine assumptions about the evolution of song, aggression and bright colours



Talk by Kristal Cain – School of Biological Sciences, University of Auckland Thursday 20 September, 7.30pm

Buried in our understanding of evolution and animal behaviour are many entrenched assumptions. Most of these assumptions have never been explicitly tested. Kristal uses birds to test some of these assumptions and along the way she has found some surprising answers. She will present some of this research, with particular focus on what makes a good female, the evolution of song and vocal learning, and the costs of bright plumage. These studies included research on sparrows in North America, fairy wrens and finches in Australia, and pukeko and titpounamu (rifleman) in New Zealand.
