Readers may have noticed unusual looking contraptions such as the one pictured here, placed on various properties in Waiatarua. Our property also has one of these. They are beetle surveillance traps, deployed by Biosecurity New Zealand and the Ministry of Primary Industries, to ascertain whether an exotic pest, the Granulate Ambrosia beetle, is in our area.



This beetle is native to tropical and subtropical East Asia and has been introduced to many areas in the world, including Africa, USA, Central America, Europe and some Pacific Islands. During routine surveillance by Biosecurity NZ, specimens of this beetle were collected from an oak tree elsewhere in Auckland and has not been recorded before in New Zealand.

#### The threat

This species (pictured above) can cause two distinct types of economic damage. Firstly, it can weaken or kill living trees. Secondly, it

can cause damage to stored timber by mass colonisation of the dead wood before it is processed.

In living trees, the action of the female beetle (measuring 2.1 -2.9mm in length) boring in wood and introducing fungus can cause

a decline in tree health. An infestation can cause wilting and dieback of the tree, and may even cause death of nursery plants, saplings and trees. It has been reported as a pest of nursery stock and young trees.

Because this beetle attacks a wide variety of plant species, it can become an abundant pest in urban, agricultural or forest areas. It is known to attack a wide range of fruit and ornamental tree species. It is, however, not recorded to be a pest of conifers.



I was informed by the two men from Biosecurity NZ who installed the trap at our place that it would remain there for around a month, with regular checks by them. At the time of writing our trap was still there and it is as yet unknown whether any beetles were actually found.

# Get your home ready

# Be prepared before an emergency strikes



### Meeting place

Your house should be your main meeting point after an emergency. However, you should have an alternative location arranged in case you cannot get home.

It is best to remain in your home if it is still habitable. The next best option is to stay with family or friends. Auckland Emergency Management will assist those with no options.

#### Children

Talk to your children's school or early childhood centre about their emergency plans. Provide them with contact details of at least three people who are approved to collect your children. Try to identify someone who lives within walking distance of the school or early childhood centre.

Talk with your children about what they could expect in an emergency and who might pick them up.

#### **Pets**

Ensure your pet's essentials are easily accessible. This includes food, water, leads, ID tags, muzzles, travel boxes (labeled with your contact details) and vaccination licensing records.

### **Dependents**

If people rely on you for their everyday needs ensure you include them in your plan.

### If you are dependent

If you receive assistance from a home healthcare agency or in-home support provider, find out how the provider will respond in an emergency. Designate backup or alternative providers that you can contact.

#### **Contacts**

In an emergency, those first on the scene need to know who to call. The ICE (In Case of Emergency) system encourages mobile phone users to save their next of kin's details into their phones under the contact name 'ICE.' Talk with your family and friends about how you will tell each other that you are okay and safe, especially without the usual methods of communication.

During large emergencies, local telecommunication networks can be quickly overloaded. Use text messages rather than making phone calls. Update your voice mail message and online status.

It can be easier to call outside the region than within. Establish an out-of-region contact for the members of your household to check in with.

To be fully ready, plan for both home and away.

# **Autumn Recipe**

Love them or loathe them, feijoas are plentiful at this time of year. The feijoa is the fruit of *Acca sellowiana*, an evergreen shrub or small tree, I-7 m in height. It comes from the highlands of southern Brazil, parts of Colombia, Uruguay, Paraguay and northern Argentina. They are also grown throughout Azerbaijan, Iran (Ramsar), Georgia, Russia (Sochi), New Zealand and Tasmania. The fruit is also called the 'pineapple guava' or 'guavasteen'.

The season is short and when it's here, it's a feijoa frenzy of baking, preserving, freezing and cooking. Why not try this easy recipe below.

# Feijoa muffins

75g softened butter
I cup chopped fresh feijoas
2 eggs
3/4 cup sugar
2 tsp baking powder
2 cups flour
milk to mix



#### **Topping**

I tsp cinnamon I tbsp sugar

### Method

Preheat oven to 200°C

Cut feijoas in half and scoop out flesh with a spoon and overfill a cup

Cut feijoa flesh into pieces so cup is packed

Melt butter in a bowl

Add feijoa and stir

Add unbeaten eggs and combine

Fold in dry ingredients

Add liquid to achieve a soft consistency

Spoon into muffin pans

Mix cinnamon and sugar topping and sprinkle over muffins

Bake for 10 to 15 minutes


