A hot topic for the WRRA committee at the moment is the Waiatarua Community Hall and its financial stability, essentially keeping the Hall's expenses balanced with fees charged for hireage as best we can. Currently the expenses far outweigh the halls income, and we're working on ways to bring this back into check.

The most obvious and effective solution is to increase hall bookings. We feel there may be a lack of awareness in the community around the Hall and what it offers, so to help change that we've started a campaign to bring to front of mind all the many uses it has including birthday parties, weddings, community group gatherings, dances, playgroups, exercise classes and so on. From the Editor

My family and I have recently returned from a 3 week trip to the UK to visit my parents in law and to celebrate my father in law's 90th birthday. We had a wonderful time, but it all passed by far too quickly and before we knew it we were back on the plane heading home again. However, it was definitely worth it as we managed to pack in quite a bit during that time and also caught up with as many of our old friends there as we could.

We were pretty lucky with the weather although the temperatures during our first week were more or less the same as what we're having right now - and it's meant to be their summer! Luckily we had plenty of warmer clothes with us along with summer outfits, which we were able to wear during our last two weeks, when the weather took a turn for the better.

The English countryside is truly stunning. So different to NZ which is also beautiful, but in a rugged sort of way. It's much softer and more rolling in the UK and is particularly pretty around where my in-laws live in Northamptonshire. One of the highlights was a visit to a friend's place up on the Yorkshire moors, a part of the country to which I have never previously been. It really was spectacular there with dry stone walls bisecting the fields. While in Yorkshire we visited Skipton Castle which dates from Norman times and has an ancient yew tree growing in the castle courtyard. It was planted in 1659 and is absolutely huge. Mind boggling when you think about it, we just don't have that sort of history here in NZ.

Another thing I particularly enjoyed was a proper English afternoon tea at a beautiful country house hotel in a village called Fawsley, not far from where my in-laws live. It was a stunning location and the afternoon tea was complete with assorted cut sandwiches (including cucumber) and delicious light fluffy scones with jam and clotted cream (the ONLY sort of cream to have with scones!).

We did plenty of shopping - that's one thing I miss about living there. Even a trip to the supermarkets there was exciting due to the vast range of products available. The shopping trip was not complete without a visit to IKEA where we picked up a few goodies to bring back home. It can't arrive here soon enough in my opinion!

We visited the local village pub quite a number of times and how lovely it was to be able to walk there, sit in their pleasant garden bar, enjoy a few drinks and a delicious meal along with other families, and then walk home again. Wouldn't it be great if we had pubs like that in West Auckland!

Now it's back to reality, but we have many happy memories of our holiday and are looking forward to going back sometime. That said, it's certainly a good feeling to be home again.

Talk by Eugenie Sage – Minister for Conservation, Associate Environment Minister and Land Information Minister

Thursday August 15th 7.30pm

We are extremely pleased to announce that the Minister for Conservation, Eugenie Sage will be talking to us in August. Eugenie will give us an overview of current Government conservation policies followed by her thoughts on important issues for Auckland Region, including the urgent need for more no-take marine reserves. After her talk there will be a Q&A session for your burning questions.

Eugenie spent her first 25 years in Tāmaki Makaurau/Auckland. She studied law and history at Auckland University and then journalism at Canterbury University, settling in Christchurch. After graduating she worked in environmental forestry, as a political and media adviser at Parliament, a freelance journalist and then spent 13 years campaigning with Forest and Bird, including to protect West Coast beech and rimu forests and the South Island high country.

She is proud to have been made a Distinguished Life Member by Forest and Bird and values the huge amount of practical conservation work volunteers do around the country. Eugenie campaigned for the protection of Canterbury's rivers and groundwater and was elected to the Canterbury Regional Council in 2007. In 2011 she stood for the Green Party and was then elected to Parliament.

Preparedness need not cost a lot

The latest in our series of Civil Defence articles

Most emergency items are regularly found in homes, and others are able to be improvised or shared.

For example:

a car radio is a battery-powered radio

a phone recharger in the car can charge your phone if the power is out

a damp tea towel can be used as a dust mask

talk to your neighbours about sharing a gas barbecue.



Use battery operated lights or chemical light sticks - the use of candles can be dangerous and is not recommended as a lighting source.

Leave a written message in a place known by your family and friends if you need to evacuate. Make this part of your planning.

A Getaway Kit

A getaway kit is a small bag or backpack of essential items to take with you, if you have to evacuate your home with little warning. Consider also having emergency survival items and a getaway kit stored in your car and at work.

You can:

have a fully packed kit ready to go

have a partially packed kit with a list of the remaining items

store your getaway items in their regular place and have a list to remind you what to pack.

Remember to check these items and review your list regularly.

You may need to evacuate on foot, so distribute items among the members of your household, ensuring what you are taking is not too heavy or bulky. If evacuating:

take your getaway kit

turn off electricity and water (do not turn off gas unless you suspect a leak or have been asked to do so by authorities)

take your pets with you

Keep physical or digital copies of important documents and photos on a memory stick stored in an alternative location or online (in the cloud).

Try to keep your vehicle fuel tank topped-up.

Accidents happen, and if your house catches fire who is going to save your life? A house fire can be unsurvivable less than 5 minutes after it starts. The Fire Brigade won't get 5;32 pm, Thu 27 June, Rayner Rd, Piha, there in that time.

The only people who can save the lives of Contacts you and your family, are you. And your chances are greatly improved if you're prepared, with working smoke alarms and a plan to get out of your house.
