Brave Zack making good recovery after bush ordeal

Remember the 9 year old Rottweiler Zack who was found two weeks after going missing, having been being spooked by thunder while his family were overseas? Devastated, they returned and searched relentlessly for their big baby.

Christmas came early for the Going household when, after 14 days, a neighbour reported a big dog barking in the gully behind their house. Zack's mum Mandy immediately began the search and located him at the bottom of a steep ravine. There ensued a 3 hour full on emergency services rescue orchestrated by our amazing local Waiatarua Volunteer Fire Brigade, which extended to a team of around 20 paid fire staff and line crew who winched Zack up to safety.



Amazingly, Zack had no broken bones but without eating and being stuck in the same position for such a long time he was weak and on the verge of starvation and dying. Zack's good wishes. Without our body was being overtaken by infection and was shutting down. The emergency vet later reported that he had extensive injuries inside and out, and it would be a long road to recovery.

With the incredible care and compassion from Tarien at our

local West Coast Veterinary Hospital, the ongoing support and love from Kim and Skater and the volunteers at Rottweiler Rescue, and Zack's loving family, he has made a remarkable recovery with the last of his stitches being removed at the beginning of January. Zack

can now concentrate on getting back to his full healthy self, inside and out.

Zack is the true champion of this story - lying in a creek at the bottom of a ravine, his nails and paws raw from trying to climb the steep cliff. He was almost to the point of starving and was frozen to the core, yet still he barked for his family.

Now safe and happily back

home with his loved ones, Zack's wounds are healing. Hopefully, with time, he will have the strength to run and play like the big puppy he is. His gorgeous happy nature has shone through to all the hearts he has touched over the last few months.

Zack's family wish to thank every one of you who has so generous-

ly donated, posted, shared and sent kind messages and amazing Waiatarua community and compassion, this would have been a very different ending for Zack and his fami-

If we can learn anything from Zack's story it is to not give up and never lose hope. If you hear or see something out of the ordinary, don't turn your back, investigate, report and share it. The smallest acts can have profound outcomes.

Got pests on your property? Announcing the Waiatarua Trap Library, launching on the 22nd March. Come along and borrow some traps to rid your property of unwanted pests!

How it works: You will need to attend a 30 minute training session to learn effective tools for traps placement and how to set the traps.

Bring along: One form of photo ID and proof of address (a bill or similar).

You will then be able to borrow traps for a period of 3 months (or more — see below).

You will need to record your catches either on paper or via the app (training provided). If you continue to catch pests after your initial 3 months, you can extend your borrowing period!











