

## Water woes for beleaguered **Waiatarua**

A raging torrent of water gushed across Rimu Rd and flooded properties on the morning of Thursday 20 February, the result of a burst water main. This meant the fourth water outage for those on town supply in almost as many weeks, causing inconvenience, frustration and irrita-



tion to many. According to local sources the water leak has made a considerable mess, burying a culvert. AT and ACC have said

they will look at it by 26 March, which is several weeks away.

Meanwhile, Waiataruans on the upper side of Bush Rd, and our neighbours in Piha, pray desperately for rain to fill their water tanks. Some face a wait of many weeks for water delivery as water tanker companies struggle to meet the high demand in this exceptionally hot weather.

Whether on mains or tank water, Waiatarua is suffering and seemingly

neglected by ACC and Watercare. Most concerning of all in these extremely dry conditions is our vulnerability to fire. Let's hope we get some decent rain soon, and Watercare manage to sort out the seemingly ongoing issues with the town supply once and for all.

Lecture Series: The scientific dilemmas of climate change: where are we now, and what is a NET?

## By Professor Roger Davies Thursday, 19 March at 7.30pm

Roger Davies, Professor of Climate Physics at the University of Auckland will start with an objective overview of climate change and where it appears to be heading. The goal will be to demystify the science behind climate change by answering the following questions:

What do we know for sure? Agreed to by most or all climate scientists.

What is plausible but not proven? ... but just as hard to disprove.

What is best-guess speculation? This is where the scientific discussion gets most heated.

He will also talk about unresolved climate science dilemmas that he finds interesting and will then look into the future and introduce the latest buzz word "NET".

## Fire Brigade News

At the time of writing, the entire North Island is under a total fire ban - the only exceptions essentially being self-contained, spark-free barbecues or braziers in a safe place on your own property. The ban includes incinerators and fireworks.

Fire conditions are currently more extreme here that they were for the 2017 Port Hills or 2019 Nelson fires, so please take extra care!

It may rain again one day (those of us on tank supply are looking forward to that!) and once it's safe enough, Rural Fire will change us back to a Restricted Fire Season. That means you'll need to get a permit before lighting any fire, and it takes a few days. Check and start the permit process at http://checkitsalright.nz

## **Environmental News — Trap Library Reminder**

Following on from the announcement in last month's newsletter.

How it works: You will need to attend a 30 minute training session to learn effective tools for traps placement and how to set the traps.

Bring along: One form of photo ID and proof of address (a bill or similar).

You will then be able to borrow traps for a period of 3 months (or more — see below).

You will need to record your catches either on paper or via the app (training provided). If you continue to catch pests after your initial 3 months, you can extend your borrowing period!
